ANY MAN CAN MAKE MONEY LIKE PONZI

Here's the Recipe for Blooming \$10 Where You Had Only \$1 Before

INVOLVES TRAVEL, BUT—

A formula for making ten little dollars bloom where only one bloomed before was given to W. W. MacFarlane, of Elkins Park, by a friend writing from London.

The plan rests on the fluctuations of foreign exchange and in some respects resembles the scheme which is claimed to have made a multi-millionaire of Charles Ponzi, of Boston.

The figures given in the letter from London were based on the rates of exchange existing last February, but are more or less applicable to present-day conditions. Here is the golden tip:

"Leave America with, say, about \$350. Change it into 100 English pounds, present exchange in London. Add to these 100 francs and exchange into French silver coins and you have 4200 French francs.

"Smuggle these coins into Switzerland. Here they attain twice the value they had in France because, while the French silver franc is normal in Switzerland, the French paper franc is worth but half its face value in exchange. Change the silver francs into Italian paper lire. Then pass on into Italy and cash into Italian silver lire.

"You now have 21,000 Italian silver lire. Take these back into Switzerland and you have 21,000 Swiss francs. Now purchase French paper money and you will receive for it 42,000 French francs. Return to France, there buy English notes and proceed to London with \$1000 instead of the \$350 you set out with.

"Change these into American money at the present exchange and you have about \$3500 instead of the \$350 you started with. Of course, you must pay your expenses and do a bit of smuggling, but you make money."

Woolen Mills on Short Schedule
Boston, Aug. 6.—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say: "The wool and wool textile trade is still waiting the turn of the market, which seems very slow in development. Mills are running generally on short schedule and reopenings are still uncertain. Sales of wool and tops and yarns have been few and at prices on the low side, generally. Advice from Yorkshire indicates a slightly firmer tone there. The foreign primary markets are generally dull and easy. As for the domestic primary market there is little new represented."
