

AMERICAN LEGION PREPARES RITUAL

New Service Is Expected to Be of Great Benefit to Many Posts

POST TO CONDUCT FUNERAL

An American Legion ritual for use of all the posts in the United States has been prepared by a committee of the national organization and has been forwarded to commanders throughout the country.

This ritual will fill a long-felt want in the organization. It has the endorsement of Franklin D'Oller, national commander, and is submitted as the work of a committee appointed at the Minneapolis national convention composed of Dr. A. D. McKinley, Des Moines, Ia.; Guy C. Chambers, Lincoln, Neb.; and Dr. W. L. Longstreth, Sisseton, S. D.

Under the terms of this ritual there will be portions of the meetings which will be open only to members. The business sessions can be, and in the opinion of many members should be, open, so that the influence of the Legion may be widespread.

The new ritual specifically provides for an impressive initiation ceremony.
