JAMES O'NEILL, NOTED ACTOR, DIES AT 70
Started Stage Career as Super With Edwin Forrest in Cincinnati
New London, Conn., Aug. 10.—(By A. P.)—James O'Neill, the actor, died at the Lawrence Memorial Associated Hospital early today. He had been ill for two months at the hospital suffering from an internal disorder. His wife and sons were at the bedside. He was seventy years of age.

Mr. O'Neill had been in a coma for a month. He was left in a weakened condition nearly two years ago after he was struck by an automobile in New York. When his health began to fail last spring he was sent to St. Vincent's Hospital, New York. After leaving that institution he suffered a relapse and was brought here.

James O'Neill first gained fame on the stage through his impersonation of Edmond Dantes, in 'Monte Cristo.' Mr. O'Neill's last appearance in this city was 'The Wanderer,' a specialty.

During the last ten years the actor had been ear deaf's door several times, but managed to rally as a result of a strong constitution. He had a decidedly pleasing personality, and was actually revered by actors generally. Mr. O'Neill was born in Kilkenny, Ireland, November 15, 1849. He made his first appearance on the stage as a super in the National Theatre in Cincinnati during the engagement of Edwin Forrest, the tragedian. He later played Icelinus in the support of Mr. Forrest, and also toured the country in 'Macbeth' in support of Charlotte Cushman. In 1875 he joined A. M. Palmer's New York stock company and created many parts. He made his appearance in 'Monte Cristo' in 1883 and presented the play continuously for sixteen years. He later appeared in Shakespearean repertoire. Arrangements for the funeral have not yet been made.
