

WATSON ACCUSED OF "INDECENCY" "Tom" Appeared in Night Clothes—Released From Jail Under Bail TELLS OF STIMULANTS

By the Associated Press. Buford, Ga., Aug. 18.—Thomas E. Watson, once popular as a candidate for the Democratic nomination for United States senator from Georgia, together with his traveling companion, E. H. Gwinnett, were released today from the Gwinnett county jail, where they spent the night as a result of a disturbance in a hotel here.

Watson was charged with "public indecency," while Miller was charged with carrying concealed weapons. Watson's bond was fixed at \$500 and that of Miller at \$1000.

Both men agreed to leave the jail after a conference with Thomas W. Hardwick, former senator and candidate for governor, and John I. Kelly, candidate for Congress, who arrived here today.

Mr. Watson issued a written statement in which he said that since his nervous collapse in Florida two years ago he had, on advice of his physician, taken small amounts of stimulants after extraordinary exertion.
