A NEW BUSINESS VENTURE. This man is stationed along the Seine in Paris, where he washes dogs—at the reasonable price of three cents.



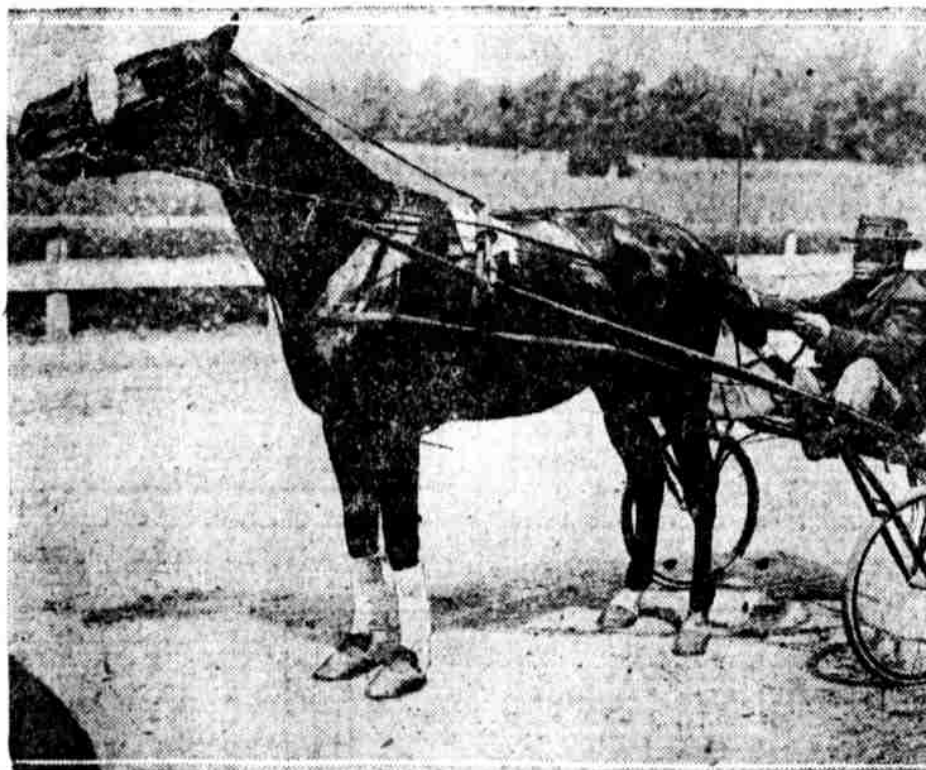

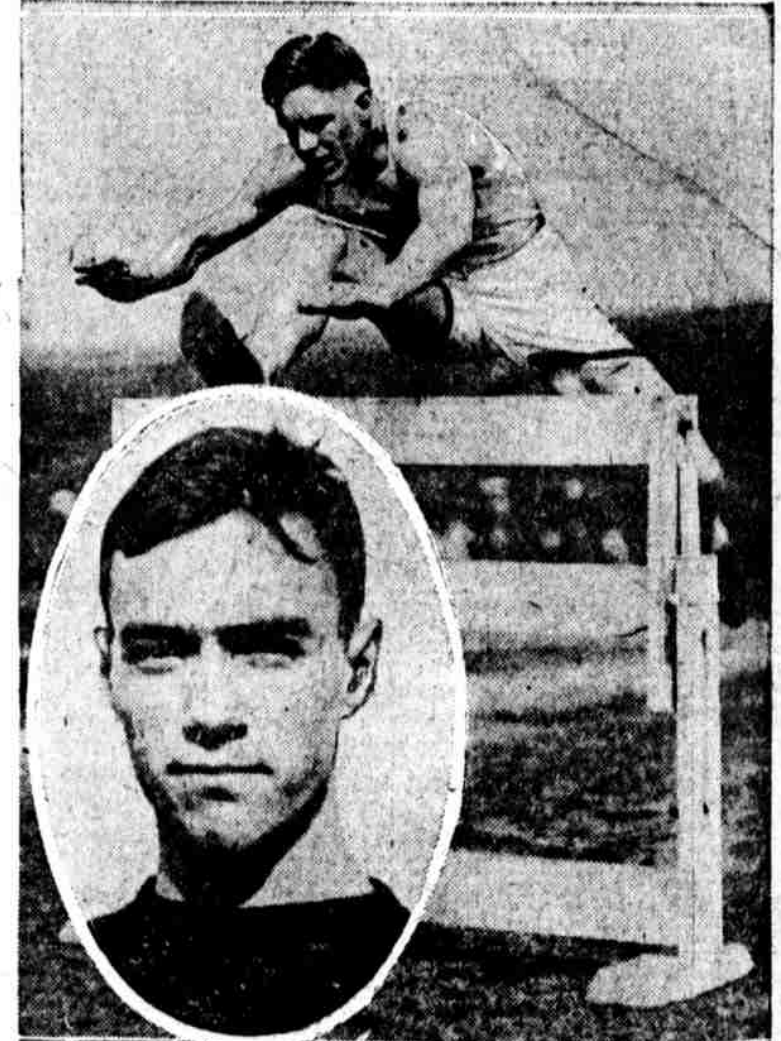

SECRETARY AND MANAGER OF BELMONT DRIVING PARK. A. Saunders is the man who sees that all things go well.

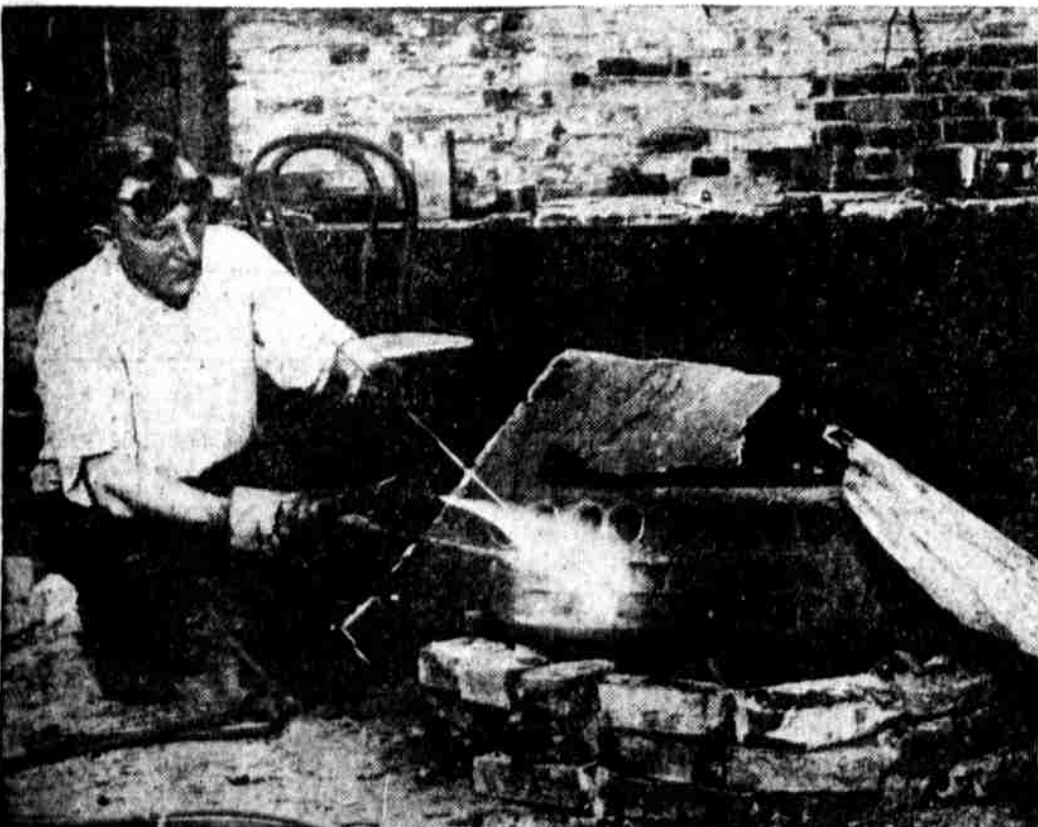


EVERYBODY KNOWS POP GEERS. The old-time driver and horse owner is much in evidence at the Belmont Driving Park this week.
