



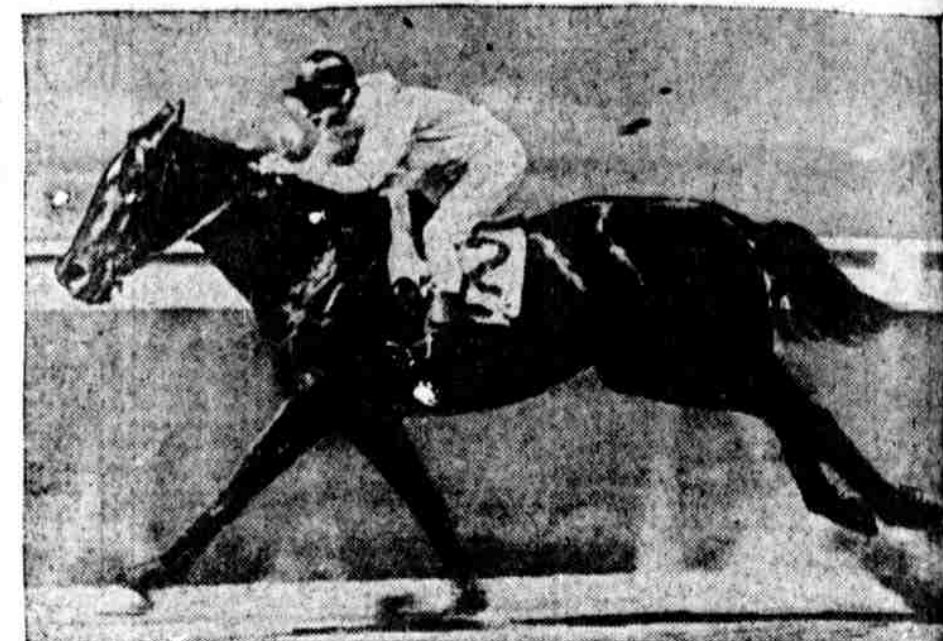
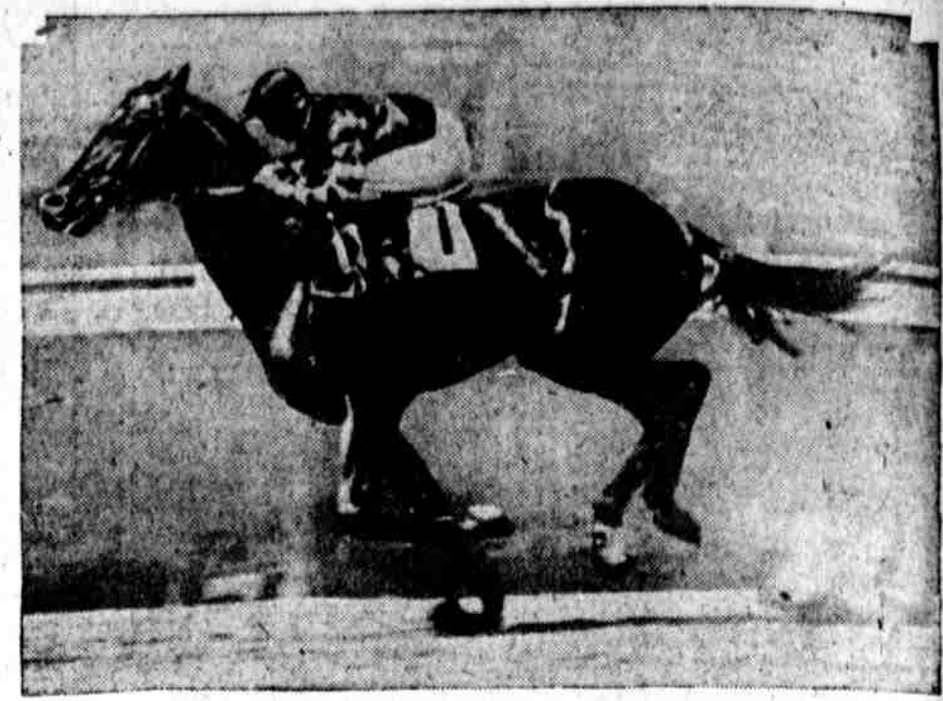
WHAT IS IT? Our guess is that it is the upper portion of an ostrich at the Philadelphia Zoo catching bits of meat. Ledger Photo Service.

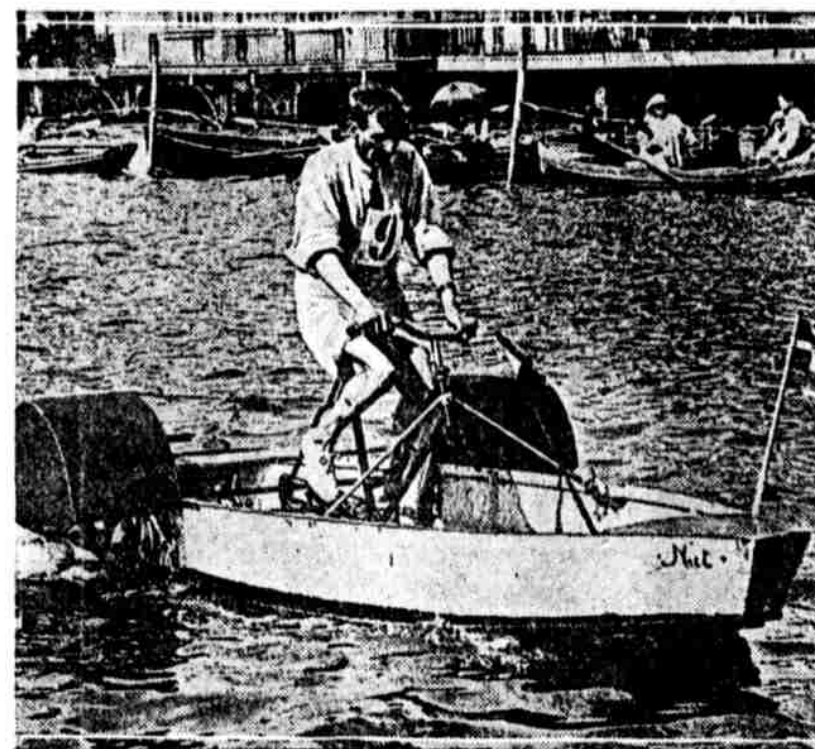

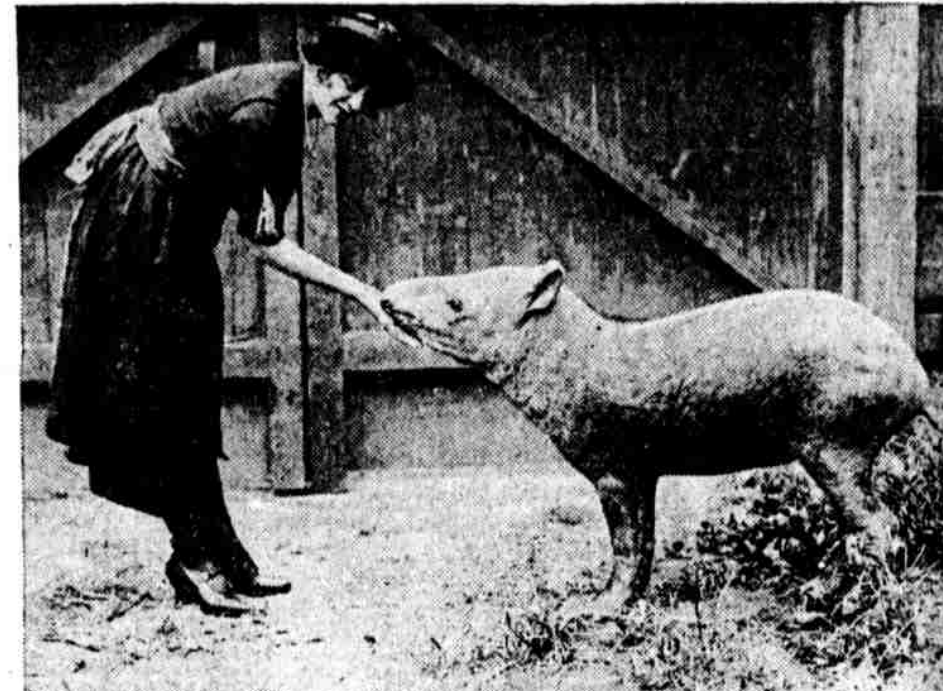

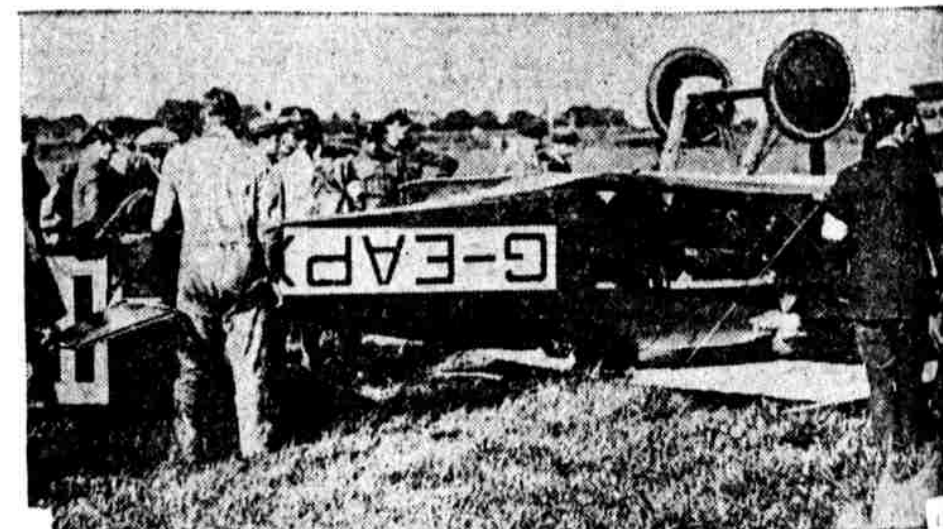

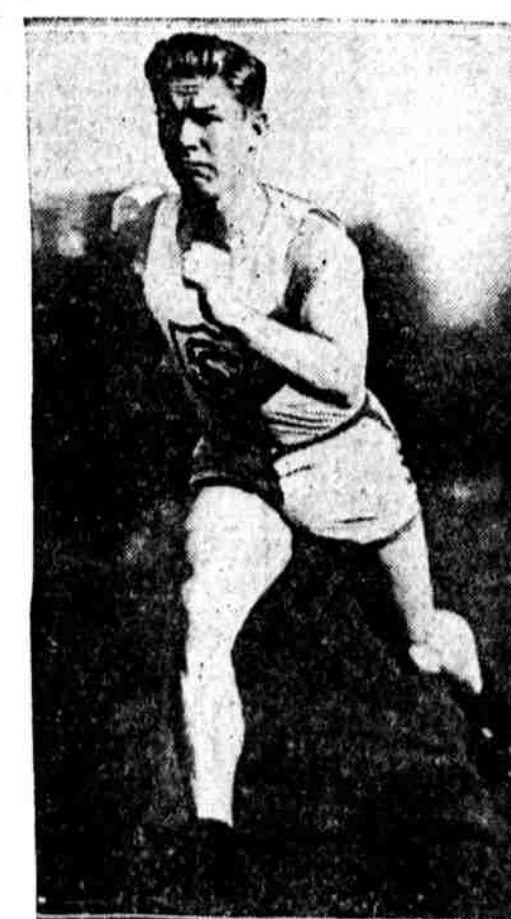
