The rifles were furnished by W. L. Hicks, superintendent of state armaments, Harrisburg, who also provided the belts. The arrangement was effected by William A. It is a compliment to this post that it has succeeded in equipping itself for conducting military funerals, since the War Department has failed to furnish to the Legion posts the requisite rifles, although it promised to do so.

BEDOUINS KILL CHRISTIANS

One Hundred and Fifty Residents of Village Near Jerusalem Slain

Cairo, Egypt, Aug. 26.—(By A. P.)—One hundred and fifty Christians have been killed at Ajlun, a village about fifty miles northeast of Jerusalem, by a band of Bedouins, according to a dispatch received here from Haifa, Palestine.
