Confessione Generale Industriale a Milano giovedì prossimo, con lo scopo di risolvere il problema che si presenta per l'occupazione degli stabilimenti da parte dei metallurgici in parecchie città dell'Italia. Il gruppo socialista al Parlamento terrà venerdì una riunione con il comitato che governa la Confederazione Generale dei Lavoratori e si attende che da questa riunione dipenderà la politica che gli operai dovranno adottare per le presenti anormali condizioni delle industrie.

Si calcola che 400 stabilimenti metallurgici, tra i più importanti dell'Italia, siano stati occupati dai meccanici e dagli altri operai, ed il movimento minaccia sempre più di dilagare. Elaborate misure sono state prese dal Governo per mantenere l'ordine durante il periodo di una minaccia generale offensiva contro tutte le industrie.

I proprietari degli stabilimenti dichiarano che l'aumento di paga richiesto da mezzo milione di metallurgici im-

porterebbe una maggiore spesa di un milione di lire, cosa impossibile a sostenere. Essi fanno presente che l'Italia paga per il carbone un prezzo 18 volte superiore a quello precedentemente alla guerra, mentre l'Inghilterra paga soltanto tre volte di più. L'America solo 3.5, la Francia se invole a la Germania soltanto 11 volte. Da ciò ne consegue che la produzione estera rimpiazza quella italiana. L'acciaio manifatturato in Francia è venduto a più basso prezzo di quello prodotto in Italia e quello inglese costa meno di quello italiano anche senza profitto.

Due membri del Gabinetto si receranno a Milano e si spera che la Conferenza Generale Industriale prenda

provvedimenti secondo i loro suggerimenti. Se ciò avverrà l'agitazione e l'occupazione degli stabilimenti cesserà subito. Se i risultati saranno sfavorevoli, è impossibile predire la durata e le conseguenze della lotta.

Gli operai in Roma, la scorsa notte, supponendo che la polizia volesse prendere possesso di alcuni stabilimenti, diedero l'allarme e immediatamente una folla di donne e bambini accorse presso gli stabilimenti occupati per unirsi ai loro congiunti. Durante tutta la notte carri armati peristarono le vie, mentre le mitragliatrici venivano piazzate nelle posizioni dominanti. I curiosi venivano dispersi dai carabinieri. La polizia sorveglia ogni punto della città

ed è pronta per qualsiasi eventualità. Gli operai credono che la forza tenti un attacco, ma evidentemente gli agenti e le truppe hanno ordine di sorvegliare soltanto e prevenire attacchi di sorpresa. Tutte le banche sono guardate e gli impiegati sono armati.

In alcuni stabilimenti a Torino gli operai hanno aperto le casseforti per prendere il danaro per le paghe.

Toscana. Si dice che vi siano delle vittime e le autorità hanno inviato aiuti.

Le scosse vennero intese lungo le vie ed anche a Genova e Milano.
