

CONFESS ROBBING NEAR EAST FUND

Six Former American Soldiers Said to Admit Aiding Wholesale Thefts

MAY INVOLVE MANY OTHERS

Constantinople, Sept. 13.—Six former American soldiers who have been arrested in connection with thefts of supplies from the American committee for relief in the Near East have virtually confessed and have promised to tell all they know in the hope that leniency will be shown them, according to officials investigating the situation. The thefts are said to total hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Charles Allen, American consul here, is conducting the examinations of the six men, and Charles R. Aldrich, a New York lawyer, is appearing in behalf of American contributors to the committee's funds. He was preparing to return to America, but declared he felt it his duty to remain, as no other American lawyer is available here.

A long investigation is anticipated for the purpose of determining the extent of the thefts from the committee. Officials declare that the losses from thefts, together with manipulation of funds and supplies, may be far larger than at first suspected. It is declared they extend over a period of a year and a half and involve officers of other charity war organizations, who worked temporarily

with the old American committee for relief in the Near East and then returned to the United States. The investigation was brought about by the arrest of the six former American soldiers by J. P. Coombs, former lieutenant colonel in the American army, who has been here about six months. Lieutenant Colonel Coombs advised with C. V. Vickery, general secretary of the American committee for relief in the Near East, and they decided to consult Rear Admiral Mark L. Bristol, American high commissioner here. Admiral Bristol decided that the men should be prosecuted.

Julian Gillespie, of Dallas, Texas, formerly captain in the American army, has been appointed counsel for the six prisoners. When the men were arrested they declared it would be unfair if they should suffer "and high officials who were responsible for larger sums should escape."

NO CUT FOR ENGLISH COAL

Mine Leader Condemns Unions' Demand for Lower Prices

London, Sept. 14.—(By A. P.)—Condemnation of miners' demand for a reduction in coal prices by Thomas Spencer, one of their leaders, was an important development in the coal strike situation here today.

The miners have alleged that large profits were being made by the mine owners, but it is declared official figures show that in the quarter ended last June only five areas showed any profit and that the total profit was only £8,000,000.

L'ITALIA SUPERA LA CRISI OPERAIA

La Confederazione del Lavoro si Mostra Sempre Proclive a Raggiungere un Accordo

Roma, 14 settembre.—L'Italia ha superato la crisi causata dal movimento del metallurgico, secondo il Giornale d'Italia. Nel commentare la situazione il giornale dice:

"Fino allo scorso sabato noi eravamo

all'occhio del bolscevismo. Questo pericolo sembra rimosso ed i capi degli operai sono diventati gli araldi della necessità di una maggiore produzione. Noi dovremo vedere se essi saranno capaci di far fare ciò dai loro seguaci. L'autorità governativa sono state attaccate dall'idea Nazionale, la quale dice che l'attitudine del Governo corrisponde ad abdicare ad uno straniero che comanda da Mosca e dal quale provengono i fondi per la propaganda comunista.

In un editoriale sulla presente situazione, la Tribuna osserva: "Le anomalie di una mentalità criminale hanno raggiunto un tale punto che i capi degli operai, incontrati a Milano per risolvere una gravissima situazione, non solo non hanno risolto ma hanno creato nuovi imbarazzi."

L'attitudine del Presidente del Consiglio, On. Giolitti, è lodata dal

"Tempo," il quale dichiara che la stretta neutralità del Primo Ministro nella vertenza del metallurgico ha prodotto dei risultati per i quali dobbiamo congratularci. La sua prudenza e l'imparziale tattica ha impedito convulsioni rivoluzionarie le quali potevano degenerare in pericolosi e paralizzanti eccessi.

Milano, 14 settembre.—Enrico Matta ha chiesto che il presente movi-

mento del metallurgico in Italia sia esteso allo scopo di distruggere il presente sistema sociale della nazione, durante una riunione di unionisti alla quale prese egli parte come capo degli anarchici. Tale riunione avvenne perché chiamata dalle unioni che si oppongono alla Confederazione del Lavoro e che vogliono che una intesa sia raggiunta tra tutte le organizzazioni che non condividono le idee della Confederazione. Malatesta ed altri capi degli anarchici

e sindacalisti proposero la formazione di un "comitato di azione" con lo scopo di raggiungere la rivoluzione. Il deputato Giolitti, presidente della Federazione degli uomini di mare, dichiarò che l'organizzazione era unita ed sostenne il partito socialista, ma che senza un completo accordo riguardo l'azione rivoluzionaria, tra il partito socialista, la confederazione del lavoro e le organizzazioni sindacaliste, egli non credeva giustificato di prendere una

decisa azione rivoluzionaria in nome degli uomini di mare.
