

### CITY WILL GREET OLYMPIC STARS

#### Mayor Moore to Attend Meeting of Reception Committee This Afternoon

Mayor Moore will be among the thirty or more members comprising the representative citizens' committee that has in hand the reception to the twenty-two Philadelphia members of the victorious American Olympic team and which will meet this afternoon in the reception room of the Chamber of Commerce, Widener Building, for the purpose of completing details of the reception.

The reception will be held October 6 or 7, and it is planned to have a big street parade, in which all the city's athletic clubs will take part. This will be followed by a testimonial dinner. Among those who will be present at the meeting this afternoon are Samuel J. Dallas, president of the A. A. U.; A. C. McGowan, president of the Meadowbrook Club; Ellis A. Gimbel, president of the Philmont C. C.; Harry Penn Burke, former commodore of the Schuyl-

kill Navy; Charles H. Graklow, exalted ruler B. P. O. Elks; and Michael J. Slattery, president C. Y. M. N. U. Jack Kelly, world's champion sculler, will arrive in New York tomorrow with his Olympic rowing laurels. Philadelphia's famous oarsman is aboard the liner Carmania, which was due to dock yesterday, but a fog delayed the ship off Halifax.

A reception committee of Falls of Schuylkill residents, neighbors and friends of the oarsman, went to New York to welcome him only to learn that the fog had forced the Carmania to put in at Halifax.

The members of the committee are Miss Elizabeth Kelly, Jack's sister; Miss Loveland, the Rev. David Kelly, the Rev. Dr. Donner, Charles McElvain, Thomas Gavaghan, Joseph Bergin, Edward Byrne, Thomas and Edward Prongerast, Frank Lally, John Carroll, Leo McGafferty and James Hart. They will meet the conquering hero tomorrow. The reception will be held at the Cafe de Riveria on Wednesday evening.
