Prisoner Has Another Bad Night and Pains in Head Re-

By the Associated Press London, Sept. 24.-Terence Mac-Swiney, lord mayor of Cork, was in a very exhausted condition this morning at Brixton prison, according to a bul-letin issued by the Irish Self-determination League.

He spent a very bad night, the bulletin declared, and the severe pains in his head, of which he has complained frequently began again this morning. Officials at the London headquarters of the Irish Self-Determination League manifested no anxiety last evening over the immediate danger of Lord Mayor MacSwiney's death, but stoutly main-taining that he was receiving no food.






