

ARSENAL MAN SLAIN BY ROW OVER MONEY

Former Roommate Accuses Him of Theft of \$10, Then Fires Fatal Shot

IS PLACED UNDER ARREST

During a dispute over the disappearance of \$10, Peter Olsen, 202 South Third street, was shot to death late last night by William Forsburg, Third street near Walnut. Forsburg was arrested... According to police, Forsburg, who is a woman, and Olsen, a Frankford arborer, formerly roomed together. When they met last night in the saloon of Fred Scholler, Third and Spruce streets, Forsburg accused Olsen of the theft of \$10. Olsen denied the charge and a heated argument arose. Finally, police say, Forsburg drew a pistol and fired one shot. The bullet struck Olsen near the heart and he fell unconscious. He was taken to the Pennsylvania Hospital, where he died shortly after being admitted... When police of the Third and Spruce streets station were notified of the shooting, Special Policeman Flynn was sent to the saloon. He arrested Forsburg and Samuel W. Olsen, a bartender at the saloon. The bartender was held as a material witness.
