The police closely questioned Forbes and Corcoran. They admitted they had been drinking with Grego, but in-sisted they had nothing to do with the ooting. Forbes said Grego told him



he was feeling badly and asked that some money be taken to his wife in the some money be taken to his wile in the upstairs room. Forbes complied with his son-in-law's request, he said. While he was gone he heard the revolver shot and upon returning found Grego lying on a couch with a wound in his temple and a .32-caliber revolver near him.
