

SOUTHERN GOVERNORS TO STOP NIGHT RIDING

Destruction of Cotton Gins and Lawlessness Continues in Spite of Warnings

Atlanta, Ga., Oct. 12.—(By A. P.)—The shooting to death yesterday of a

negro guard at a cotton gin in Arkansas, numerous fires of undetermined origin, in which cotton has been destroyed and widespread threats of night riders to burn gins whose owners ignore warnings to discontinue operations until the staple reached a price of forty cents a pound, have resulted in the issuance of proclamations by Governors Brough, of Arkansas, and Kilby, of Alabama, and statements of their position by Governors Dorsey, of Georgia, and Cooper, of South Carolina.

The governor called upon the state adjutant general and sheriffs of counties "where there are likely to be disturbances" to use all power at their command to "suppress these night-riding outrages." Posts of the American Legion also were urged to co-operate with the authorities.

"This character of lawlessness deliberately violates one of the fundamental purposes for which government is established and threatens to substitute for orderly government a reign of terror and vengeance," the governor declared.

In a proclamation citing the burning of gins and ginhouses in Alabama Governor Kilby has offered a reward of \$250 for the arrest and conviction of any person guilty of the destruction of property.
