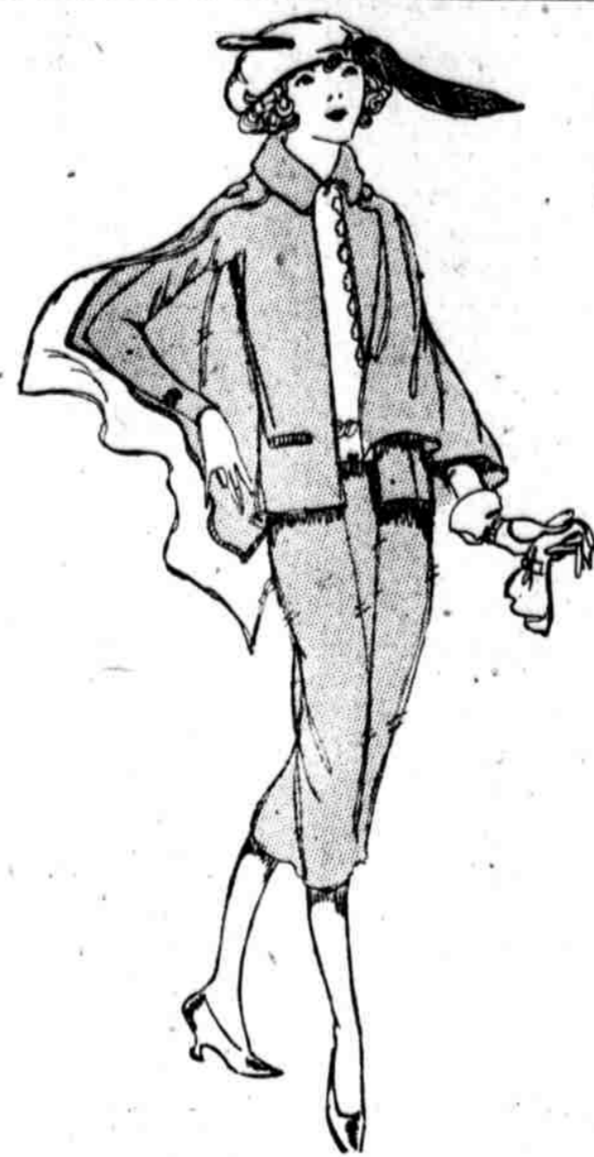

GOODIES FROM PUMPKINS SUGGESTED BY MRS. WILSON

THE frost is now glistening on the pumpkins, the moon hangs high in the sky and the biting of the hounds brings visions of spicy goodies that can be made from the pumpkin.

Pumpkin Pie From the early Colonial days this delicacy has always been a great favorite. To prepare the pastry for this pie place in a mixing bowl:

Two cups of flour, One-half teaspoon of salt, Two tablespoons of baking powder.

Squash Pancakes Place in a mixing bowl One cup of cornmeal, One teaspoon of salt, Two tablespoons of sugar, One tablespoon of shortening, One cup of boiling water.

Pumpkin Waffles Place in a mixing bowl One cup of milk or water, One cup of steamed pumpkins, One egg, One level tablespoon of baking powder.

Indian Pudding Place two and one-half cups of water in a saucepan and add One teaspoon of salt, One-half cup of molasses, One-quarter cup of shortening, Bring to a boil and add one cup of cornmeal and stir to prevent lumping.
