Man Accuses Himself After Enlisting to Escape Penalty for McGinn's Death

Carman Campellone. of Twelfth street near Catharine, collapsed in a New York army recruiting station yesterday, and confessed to the murder of Detective Joseph McGinn.

Detective McGinn was shot to death the night of October 3, when, in raiding a gambling house at Eighth street and Passyunk avenue, he interrupted robbers who were holding up the place.

One of the hold-up men shot McGinn and escaped.

"I can't go any further. I shot a detective and killed him in a Philadelphia gambling house," Campellone cried, as he fell in the recruiting station yesterday.

Campellone then told the recruiting efficers he had participated in the hold-up the night of October 3, and had fired the shot that struck Detective McGinn in the head.

He is said to have told army officers he hid in the Italian quarter until yesterday morning, when he enlisted in the army at a recruiting station in this city.




