

IL PRETESO COLPO DI STATO IN ITALIA

Nonostante le Smentite si Dice che Tutto Dipendera' Dagli Avvenimenti

Milano, 26 ottobre.—Nonostante le smentite da Roma e da Fiume, nel cerchio generalmente ben informato si asserisce che un colpo di stato si sta preparando e che la sua attuazione dipenda unicamente dal corso degli avvenimenti.

Si insiste sul fatto che anima e protagonista del colpo sia Gabriele D'Annunzio e si fanno anche nomi di deputati, senatori, generali e principi quali sarebbero pronti a collaborare all'instaurazione di una dittatura militare.

Il giornale "La Stampa" di Torino è stato il primo a gettare l'allarme di un possibile colpo di stato. In un articolo intitolato "Avanti!" ha confermato esortando le masse a ribellarsi a qualsiasi tentativo di dittatura militare.

Washington, D. C., 26 ottobre.—La Lega delle Nazioni ha probabilmente chiamato a decidere la questione di Fiume e dell'intero problema Adriatico. Ci sono informazioni giunte a Washington, in quali lasciano comprendere che l'Italia e la Jugoslavia sono più che mai discordi circa la delimitazione dei confini.

Roma, 26 ottobre.—Un importante Consiglio dei Ministri ha avuto luogo sotto la presidenza dell'on. Giolitti. Fu deciso di riprendere i negoziati con la Jugoslavia riguardo la questione dell'Adriatico e di raggiungere una conclusione in una via o nell'altra, prima della riapertura del Parlamento, la quale è stata fissata per il giorno 10 novembre.

SOVIETS SEIZE LITHUANIA

Government Displaced by Pro-Bolshevik Regime, Kovno Reports London, Oct. 27.—(By A. P.)—Resignation of the Lithuanian Government and establishment of a pro-Bolshevik regime is reported in a Central News dispatch from Riga.

Polish troops have attacked positions held by Lithuanian forces along the railroad near Orany, according to a dispatch from Kovno. After a fight lasting for five hours the Lithuanians were forced to retreat nearly two miles, it is said.

Paris, Oct. 27.—News that military movements have been going on for some weeks clandestinely in East Prussia, involving the advance of a considerable number of German troops, with cannon and machine guns, into Lithuania, has reached the foreign office through the interallied mission.

German Nationalists for Monarchy Berlin, Oct. 27.—(By A. P.)—Dr. Karl Helfferich, former vice chancellor during the imperial regime, was vigorously applauded yesterday when he asserted the necessity of re-establishing the monarchy during an address before the Nationalist Congress.

BOLIVIAN REVOLT QUELLED

Twenty-seven Leaders of Unsuccessful Uprising Executed Buenos Aires, Oct. 27.—(By A. P.)—A brief, but unsuccessful, revolution broke out in Bolivia, according to advices received here today. The movement was immediately suppressed and twenty-seven of its ringleaders were executed.

Lima, Peru, Oct. 27.—(By A. P.)—Reports in circulation here of a revolution in Bolivia were officially denied by the Bolivian legation today, the legation officials asserting that the rumors probably were caused by a street demonstration promoted by an army officer, Major Quintanilla, for political purposes.
