LANCASTER WHEAT LEADS

County Produces One-ninth State's 27,000,000 Bushels

Harrisburg, Oct. 27.—(By A. P.).— Lancaster county produced 2,905,668 bushels of wheat this year and led the etate of Pennsylvania, whose wheat crop was 26,774,760, according to figures issued today by the Department of Agriculture. Erie county led with best average per acre showing 23.1 hels. Lancaster produced 22.7. The 'million bushel counties" are once more in the south central section, being Berks, Cumberland, Franklin, Lancas-

ter and York.

Beeks led in oats production with 1,-719,992 bushels or 43.1 per acre, Erie being next with 1,465,000. Berks is also the banner county for rye, showing 317,929 bushels, Bucks is next with 210,100.

MORE HUNTERS THAN BEARS
