Londra, 14 novembre.—D'Annunzio avrebbe occupato Castua, ad occidente di Fiume, ma avrebbe trovato resistenza da parte della popolazione jugoslava, secondo il corrispondente da Milano del secondo il corrispondente da Jiliano dei Times. Un'altra spedizione ha lasci-ato Fiume venerdi', sbarcando, a Sebenico. Una banda di fiumani ayrebbe; invaso il subburbio di Sussak, distruggendo le fabbriche slave. Il corrispondente aggiunge che tuttocio, ha incontrato la popolare disapprovazione, peiche l'Italia ha accettato favorelmente i termini dell'accordo di

Rapallo.

Il corrispondente dice pure che i giornali di Milano condannano l'azione di D'Annunzio. Il giornale "Il Secolo" in un forte articolo dice che D'Annunzio ha passato tutti i limiti ed aggiunge: "Che cosa pensera" il mondo di noi?".

Il Corriere della Sera descriva l'azione del poeta come disperata e pazzesca, che lo pone in conflitto con l'Italia e potenzialmente con la Jugo-plavia.


