

SLAYER OF COP MUST GO TO CHAIR

Jersey Errors Court Affirms Conviction—Fifty Decisions Are Announced

CAMDEN ALIENATION CASE

Trenton, Nov. 16.—Among more than fifty decisions by the Court of Errors and Appeals yesterday was one affirming the conviction of Philip Schillie, 27, of Camden, of the death house in the state prison for killing Patrick J. Ryan, Lieutenant of the Newark police force, July 16, 1919.

The court affirmed a verdict of \$1500 obtained before Judge Kates in the Camden circuit by Oliver M. Davenport, of this city, against Charles E. Holden, of Camden, in which Davenport charged Holden with alienating his wife's affections. Mrs. Davenport is now resident of Collingswood.

The court set aside an order of the Atlantic circuit directing Mrs. Eleanor Jordan, of Atlanta, Ga., to turn over to the Atlantic Safe Deposit and Trust Co., as executor for her late husband, Albert M. Jordan, certain securities alleged to have been the property of Mr. Jordan.

A decree advised by Vice-Chancellor Buchanan under which Edward S. Woodward, of Meriden, Conn., was enjoined from removing a suit of attachment in Philadelphia against Frank Grover and Clarence Grover, of Hightstown, is reserved.

Damages for personal injuries aggregating \$1404 recovered in the Mer-

cer circuit by Clinton W. and Lottie Dryden, of Haddonfield, near Princeton, were reversed.

Damages for \$7500 obtained in the Camden circuit by Miss Lucy E. Work, of Merchantville, for injuries received when she was run down by an automobile of the Philadelphia Supply Co. were upheld.

PASSENGER MEN BANQUET

Philadelphia Association Cheers Suggestion Employees Own Roads

The Philadelphia Passengers Association held its annual banquet at the election of officers last night in the Baltimore and Ohio station, at Twenty-fourth and Chestnut streets. George J. Lincoln was toastmaster.

Richard Spillane caused loud applause when he said he would like to see the railroads of America owned by the employees. There was no reason, he contended, why employees should not be given the opportunity to buy such securities at two and a half points lower than a Wall street investment banker.

Mr. Spillane also urged the correction of terminal errors, claiming that the way freight has been handled constitutes a colossal error of fifty years' standing. E. J. Clegg also spoke.

The election resulted in Vice-President, William H. Katz, and George F. Ingram, secretary-treasurer, W. M. McCullough.

BRITISH ASK PROTECTION

Consul at St. Louis Gets Warning of Irish Reprisals in U. S.

Little Rock, Ark., Nov. 16.—(By A. P.)—Little Rock police yesterday were asked in a letter from British Consul W. Rumeracker, of St. Louis, to protect British subjects in this district.

The consul's letter quoted a warning purporting to be from the Amalgamated

Irish Society of America, which declared that the lives of three Englishmen in this country would be taken in reprisal for the death of every Irishman at the hands of English soldiers or police, on or after November 14.
