

LEGION TO PARADE AS BONUS SUPPORT

Big Demonstration to Take Place Saturday Afternoon. To March as Unit

American Legion posts in Philadelphia will participate in the veterans bonus parade Saturday afternoon, December 11. The counts committee, at its closing session last night, in the Chamber of Commerce assembly room, decided that the legionaries in this city should join in this demonstration, and proposed that their participation should be in favor of the four-fold plan of adjusted compensation approved by the national convention of the Legion. A committee of seven members, of

which David B. Simpson, the vice department commander, is chairman, was authorized, and was appointed by George Wentworth Carr, the county chairman, as follows: Benjamin M. Gilder, Post 37; George C. Parry, Post 61; J. G. Gordon Forster, Post 277; Walter C. Rhoades, Post 142; H. G. Harris, Post 197; and Robert E. Hanna, of the Harry L. Greenwood Post. This committee was directed in the resolution of the county committee to confer with the authorities arranging the parade and determine upon the details. Notice will be forwarded to all posts of the action of the committee. It was the sentiment of the representatives in the county organization that the Legion should appear in the parade as a unit and that uniforms should be worn with all marks of rank discarded. As a token of its appreciation of his untiring work as county chairman during the last eighteen months, the committee, through a special group, presented to Mr. Carr a gold watch. The presentation was made by Herman N. Schwartz. In accepting this remembrance Mr. Carr declared: "No apologies need be offered for the work of the county organization in Philadelphia. It has been commended by the first national commander of the legion, by the national adjutant, and it is recognized as the most efficient legion body of its kind in the United States. The legion will succeed in Philadel-

phia and elsewhere in the United States if it adheres to its original high purposes. The legion policy of favoring first of all the enactment by Congress of legislation in behalf of the disabled veterans of the World War is pre-eminently right." Philadelphia Maneto Post No. 270, headed by Vincent A. Carroll, with forty members present Friday evening, raised more than \$56 for the Christmas fund for disabled service men in local hospitals. There will be a conference in the Mayor's reception room, second floor, City Hall, tonight, when the whole program as to the distribution of gifts and the placing of Christmas trees in hospitals will be discussed and determined upon. All the energy of the legion will be devoted to carrying forward this program in this city. The Harry L. Greenwood Post has moved into its own quarters at 2771 and 2773 Frankford avenue, and will hold its first "coffee party" in its home next Friday evening. Robert E. Hanna, commander, extends an invitation to all service men in the Twenty-fifth ward to attend. It will be a housewarming for the post. This post meets the second and fourth Thursdays of each month. The post will participate in the bonus parade, and comrades are urged to report in uniform Saturdays, December 11, at headquarters.

GENERAL NIVELLE TO BE GUEST HERE

French Hero and Huguenot Society Will Be Received by Mayor Tomorrow

General Robert Georges Nivelle, the famous French hero of the world war,

and the members of the Huguenot Society of Pennsylvania will be the guests of honor at a reception to be given tomorrow at 11 o'clock in City Hall by Mayor Moore. The occasion for the reception is the third annual pilgrimage of the Huguenot Society, which has selected this city as the object of its travels this year. Following the reception the society will give a dinner at Valley Forge at 1:30 o'clock in honor of General Nivelle. During the afternoon a meeting of the society will take place in the French Protestant Church, Twenty-second and De Lancey streets, of which the Rev. Malan is the pastor. The Rev. William Elliott Griffin, D. D., will speak on "The Pilgrims, the Wallons and the Huguenots" at this meeting. Following the meeting General Nivelle will be presented with the Huguenot Cross. A luncheon will be given in his honor at 6 o'clock by the Reformed churches of Philadelphia. The various exercises will be under the direction of Gifford Pinchot, president of the society, and Edith W. Birch, secretary. General Nivelle was named by the French cabinet to represent France at this celebration because he was "an outstanding French Protestant, who would most fittingly represent both the heroic national spirit of his native land and the spiritual inheritance of those other Puritans, the French Huguenots."
