Cocunut Loaf Cake

Put one cup of coconut through the food chopper and then place in a mixture of flour, sugar, eggs, etc.

Five tablespoons of melted butter substitute.

One cup of sugar. One egg. One-half teaspoon of baking cream together until light and then add.

Devil Food Cake

Beat the eggs as directed and then add the flour, sugar, etc.
