### PLAN CHRISTMAS GIFTS

Inaugurating its program of entertainment for disabled veterans from the hospital, the Benjamin Franklin Post 405, American Legion, had its first meeting at its meeting in the Elks Club, Juniper and Arch streets, last evening wounded ex-service men.

Let me tell you of B. F. Dewees' Gift Shop at 1122 Chestnut street. This shop has conceived the clever idea of a gift shop upon their second floor, a shop where they have gathered from all departments of the larger shop attractive articles which range in price from 50c to \$5. Here one clerk waits upon you for all you buy and you receive one check—this saves time. There are too many fascinating things to mention and most of them have been repiced to the public's advantage. Beautiful shellacked Chinese baskets are less a third and sometimes a half more than their regular prices. Lovely little dressing table accessories covered in rose or silk brocade are surprisingly low in price. A brocade picture frame is \$1.50, a large pin cushion but \$1, a large silk brocade box of hairpins \$1.25. Do not forget to take a peep at some dainty satin bedroom slippers at \$2.95. But the whole little shop is exceptional! It is overflowing with gift suggestions.

The hosiery and underwear departments of that dependable shop of George Allen's at 1214 Chestnut street are particularly interesting just now, and I've found some perfect plums of bargains. Smart woolen stockings which were \$2.50 are now \$1.85; another special grade of woolen stocking is \$2.45 instead of \$3.50, and a nifty English woolen sports stocking specially priced is \$2.45. Some really lovely silk stockings worth, respectively, \$2.25 and \$2.50, are now \$1.45. The \$2.50 quality has some almost imperceptible irregularities, none of which is an imperfection. Some splendid Kayser underwear has been reduced a third. A \$10 union suit of ribbed silk is now \$6.50, and another \$10 model of all-wool is also \$6.50, while a silk-topped vest formerly selling for \$3.85 is now \$2. These are but a very few of the very tempting bargains in both departments.

Just now Theodore Siefert's establishment at 1426 Walnut street, one of my few favorite fur shops, has some delightful fur garments and smaller furs at special pre-Christmas prices. I was particularly interested in the moles and silver Siberian squirrels, both because of their beauty and because of their reduced prices. Among them are capes, dolmans, coats, scarfs and muffs. There are stunning mole and squirrel scarfs at \$50 up though the values begin at \$65, and mole muffs are priced at \$40 up instead of \$55 and silver squirrel muffs are \$60 up instead of the usual \$75. A gorgeous bargain for some lucky person is a full length cape of dark gray mole having one of the new inset shoulder capes of gray squirrel. Its pre-Christmas price is \$650 instead of \$900. These are but a few of the inviting Christmas bargains prevailing in all furs this week throughout this shop which has so high a reputation for integrity.

Just now that little Vanity Shop at 1805 Walnut street has become a veritable rendezvous for gift seekers. This shop keeps that exclusive Vanity Fair lingerie. Then, besides, there are delightful hand-made things. Fancy a handmade set of chemise-vest and petticoat-panties fashioned in luscious white silk straight from Burma. The same needlewoman has created (no other word will do) some exquisite handkerchiefs from linen she personally brought from Ireland and the lovely capes of gray squirrel. They traveled all the way from Paraguay. They are \$3.60 each. Plain, narrow-hemmed ones of indescribable daintiness, marked with a single initial to order, can be obtained for \$9 a half-dozen. 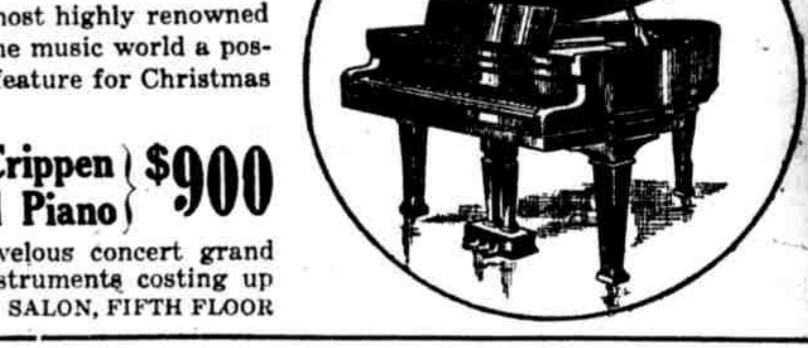
