

LEGION POSTS GET BONUS MARCH PLAN

Many Units Will Join Other Organizations, Swelling Parade to 100,000

BACK FOUR-FOLD PROPOSAL

The American Legion contingent in the bonus parade of world war veterans tomorrow at 2 o'clock has been divided into four sections, according to David B. Simpson, marshal of the Legion and vice department commander.

All veteran organizations in Philadelphia, including the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Army and Navy Union and the Spanish-American War Veterans, will participate.

Edward A. Merberle, Lafayette Post, American Legion, chairman of the parade committee of the combined veterans' conference, expects 100,000 to parade. The participation of the Legion is in the interest of the fourfold adjusted compensation plan, supported by the national organization.

E. S. Glavis, of Harbor Post, Montgomery county, will be marshal. He has been instrumental in forming the organization. The wounded veterans will be furnished automobiles.

The parade order for the American Legion follows:

First section—Marshal will take station at Broad and Dauphin streets (east side) to receive reports from his post commanders, checking off each post as it reports "present."

Formation—Dauphin street from Broad to Fifteenth street, facing east, right resting at Broad street. Posts 2, 7, 20 and 21.

Carriage street from Dauphin to York streets, facing south. Posts 30, 37, 41, 50 and 51.

Carriage street from Dauphin to Susquehanna avenue, facing north. Posts 85, 70, 83 and 87.

Fifteenth street from Dauphin to York streets, facing south. Posts 88, 80 and 94.

Fifteenth street from Dauphin to Wisconsin avenue, facing north. Posts 90, 96 and 97.

Second section—Marshal will take station at Fifteenth and Dauphin streets (west side) to receive reports from his post commanders, checking off each post as it reports "present."

Formation—Dauphin street from Fifteenth to Sixteenth street, facing east, right resting at Fifteenth street. Posts 100, 130 and 142.

Dauphin street from Dauphin to York streets, facing south. Posts 146, 151, 152, 153 and 185.

Sixteenth street from Dauphin to Susquehanna avenue, facing north. Posts 164, 174, 175 and 184.

Sixteenth street from Dauphin to York streets, facing south. Posts 186, 184 and 186.

Sixteenth street from Dauphin to Susquehanna avenue, facing north. Posts 188 and 192.

Third section—Marshal will take station at Broad and Dauphin streets (east side) to receive reports from his post commanders, checking off each post as it reports "present."

Formation—Dauphin street from Broad to Thirtieth street, facing west. Posts 197, 201, 205 and 211.

Wait street from Dauphin to York streets, facing north. Posts 222, 229 and 241.

Wait street from Dauphin to Susquehanna avenue, facing north. Posts 249, 250 and 252.

hanna avenue, facing north. Posts 249, 250, and 252.

Fourth section—Marshal will take station at Thirtieth and Dauphin streets (east side) to receive reports from his post commanders and check off each post as it reports "present."

Formation—Dauphin street from Thirtieth to Twelfth streets, facing west, right resting at Thirtieth street. Posts 297, 310 and 313.

Thirtieth street from Dauphin to York streets, facing south. Posts 315, 319, 320 and 321.
