

GIOVANNI GIOLITTI ANDRA' A LONDRA

Il Primo Ministro d'Italia Conferira' con Lloyd George per Natale

Roma, 17 dicembre.—E' stato oggi annunciato che il Presidente del Consiglio dei Ministri, On. Giovanni Giolitti, durante le prossime vacanze di Natale si recherà a Londra allo scopo di conferire con il Primo Ministro Lloyd George.

Roma, 16 dicembre.—Le dimissioni presentate dall'On. De Nicola da Presidente della Camera dei Deputati, il giorno 12 dicembre, nella seduta di oggi sono state rigettate per acclamazione. La Camera ha anche rifiutato di accettare le dimissioni del vice presidente e di altri ufficiali.

La deliberazione fu presa in seguito al rapporto di un comitato incaricato di investigare l'incossa contro il De Nicola circa irregolarità nel computare il voto della Camera il giorno 11 dicembre. L'errore nel conteggio dei voti fu ammesso dal Comitato in parola, ma fu un errore involontario ed il De Nicola fu esonerato dall'incassa fattagli.

Nei circoli politici si ritiene per certo che domani il Senato del Regno ratificherà il trattato di Rapallo, stipulato tra i rappresentanti d'Italia e della Jugoslavia per sistemazione del problema Adriatico.

Notizie private giunte da Fiume accertano che la maggioranza di quella cittadina sarà favorevole al riconoscimento del trattato di Rapallo. Disincantati giunti da Trieste recano che il Comitato di Fiume non ha permesso che si trattasse in questione. Il governo di Roma per trovare una formula che concili le due volontà di fronte al trattato di Rapallo, l'Annunzio ritiene che il trattato non possa essere ancora esigibile manomessa la sessione del Senato italiano e della Costituzione Jugoslava.

Il commento lascia intendere che le notizie provenienti da Fiume sono attualmente ritardate dalla censura governativa, per togliere l'effetto che producono le notizie contrarie.

In un ultimo telegramma da Trieste si ricorda che l'On. Ernesto Vassallo, ex ministro, giunto da Fiume, ove ha avuto diverse conferenze con Gabriele D'Annunzio e parecchi notabili della città.

SERVANTS AGAIN SEEK JOBS AND ASK LOWER WAGES, TOO

Old-Time General Housework Girl, Who Got Lost During War, Is Showing Up at Employment Offices

The good, old-time, general-housework girl—that pearl of great price, who got lost in the shuffle during the war—is showing signs of return.

A survey of employment offices in various sections of the city today showed a marked willingness of girls to return to their former occupation.

James J. Magney, of 1221 Girard avenue, reported present salaries of the average housework girl as ranging from \$12 to \$14 a week against just a little while ago.

Part of this is due to the fact that so many girls are idle now. It can also be attributed to the lack of demand just now for workers by the day.

At this time of the year, of course, there is always a slump in the demand to day workers, and just at a time when the girls are more anxious than ever to make money, it isn't very easy to get a very fair idea as to whether this condition is going to mean anything permanent.
