COLUMBIA IS DROPPED FROM PENN SCHEDULE

Penn State and Bucknell Will Also Be Missing in 1921. Lafayette Retained—Gettysburg and F. and M. Will Be Played Next Fall

IN LINE with the policy advocated by Coach Johnny Heisman, the athletic council of the University of Pennsylvania last night satisfied a football schedule containing nine instead of ten teams and with teams of lesser reputation than those played at Franklin Field during the last season.

Dr. John McCutcheon, secretary of the athletic council, after the meeting had the following to say concerning the dropping of Columbia from the Penn schedule, but will not appear this season because of a conflict in dates.

Announce Bowling Schedule. In addition to the football schedule the council also ratified the bowling list for next spring.

A Big Surprise. The greatest surprise of the new schedule is the dropping of Columbia University. Rumors had been circulated for the last several weeks that Penn State would not appear here next year and the fact that the Center County collegians were not on the schedule occasioned only a ripple of surprise.
