"Scrap-of-Paper" Statesman Succumbed to Pneumonia New Year's Night

SPRIT BROKEN BY DEFEAT AMBULANCE OVERWORKED

Berlin, Jan. 3. Dr. Theobald von Bethmann-Hollweg, former German Imperial Chancellor, died late Saturday night after a brief illness on his estate at Hohenlimburg, near Berlin. He was sixty-four years old.

Dr. von Bethmann-Hollweg was apparently in good health until Wednesday. He passed Christmas as usual with his family, but contracted a cold which developed into acute pneumonia. His condition became steadily worse and his private physician was summoned from Berlin, but the former chancellor had already become unconscious and never regained consciousness.

His wife died in 1914 and he lost his eldest son in the war. He is survived by a daughter, Countess Zech, wife of the secretary of the Prussian legation at Munich, and a son, Felix, a student at Berlin.

Recently Bent and Careworn
On the last of his frequent visits to Berlin, in November, Dr. von Bethmann-Hollweg was seen walking in Friedrich-Linden, but the severe winter night was no longer bright. Few pedestrians recognized in the stooped figure and weary face the former Imperial Chancellor.

Dr. von Bethmann-Hollweg recently completed the revision of the final proofs of the second volume of his war diary, which is intended for early publication.

VETERAN KILLED IN FALL

Lost His Balance While Opening Window in Bedroom

Reading, Pa., Jan. 3.—John J. Roth, a world war veteran, aged thirty-four years, fell from his bedroom window on the second floor of his residence home yesterday and was instantly killed, his neck being broken and skull fractured.

The accident occurred when he had prepared to retire after a day's work, and was sitting on the edge of his bed, ready to open the window. He lost his balance while opening the window. Roth was a leader in a number of civic movements in his neighborhood, which is a suburb of Reading.

Reading Man Dies Mysteriously

Reading, Pa., Jan. 3.—John W. Nae, aged thirty, was found unconscious in his room here last night and after being taken to a hospital was pronounced dead. Nae had taken a room in a lodging house a short time ago, and after being missed for two days a search was made and he was found lying in the door in agony. It is thought the man met his death by poison, although no evidence of it has been found.

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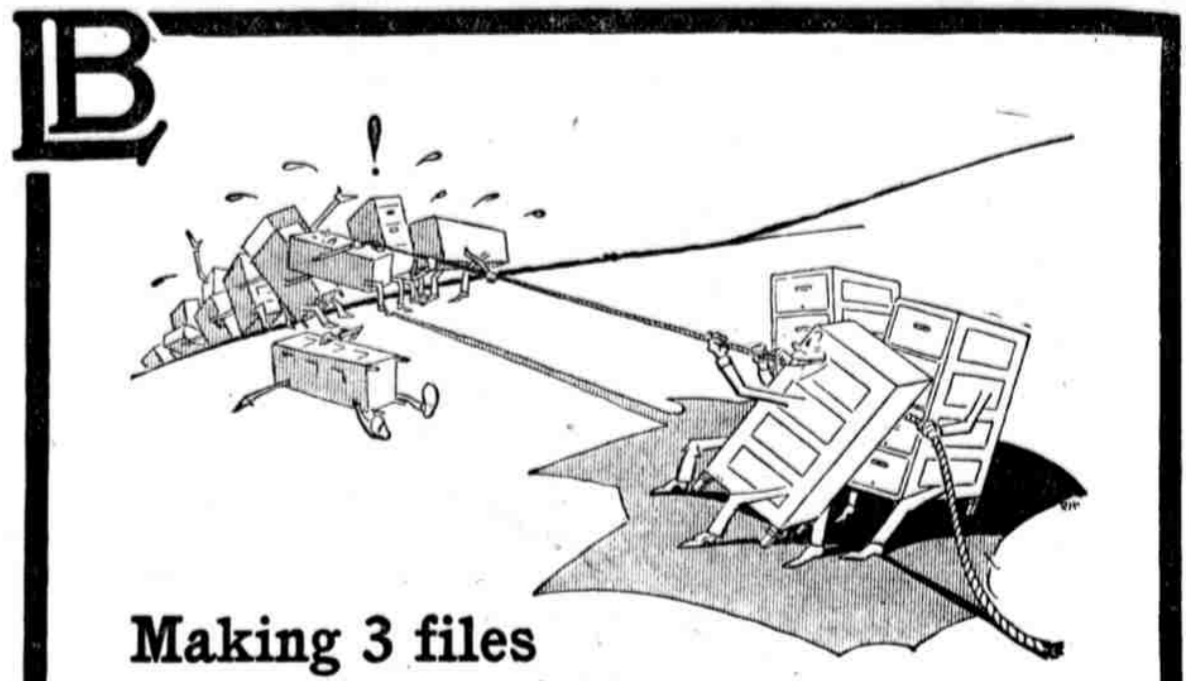
