Youthful Gloucester Robbers Decide Good Resolution Ended With 1920

UNABASHED BEFORE JUDGE

Six boys who have just reached their

teens, known in Gloucester, N. J., as the "juvenile criminal gang," who promised the police last October that they would commit no outrages until the end of the year, kept their word, but recommenced their alleged criminal career the moment the New Year was ushered in.

Lawrence Mates, ten years old, said to be the leader of the "gang." The boys were charged with robbing the store of candy, cigars, cigarettes and chewing gum valued at \$45. William S. Battersby, Taylor and Bechtel are also accused of stealing a bundle of newspapers from the Gloucester railway station and of attempting to sell them.
