American Union Congress at San Jose, Costa Rica, again has been delayed through the bolting of the Nicaraguan delegation, who, at the last moment, objected to the clause dealing with the Bryan-Chamorro treaty between the United States and Nicaragua. This necessitated new discussions and a revision of the clause.
