Governor Calls on Pennsylvanians to Help Child Victims of War

SITUATION GROWING WORSE

By the Associated Press Harrisburg, Jan. 5.—Pennsylvanians were today called upon by Governor Sproul by proclamation to give generously for the relief of the people of central and eastern Europe, particularly the children who are innocent sufferers from the disorganization produced by the war.

the funds which may be tendered for this good purpose: "Now, therefore, I, William Cameron Sproul, Governor of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do commend to the attention of our people and call upon them in their spirit of thankfulness for the blessings which they have been given, to render prompt aid to the needs of these unfortunate human beings, and give generously and substantially in answer to the appeal for assistance. We have in Pennsylvania, among our prosperous and productive citizenship, many who have come from those lands in stricken Europe where anguish and dire want are now prevalent, and who will not, I feel sure, forget their kinmen beyond the seas, but will, in their churches, their organizations and their homes, heartily join with their fellow Pennsylvanians in finding means to send help now, and these children may be saved.




