STOCKS IN GOOD DEMAND ON CURB Letters to the Editor Forgiveness Not So Easy Many Selling Orders Withdrawn. Oil's Strong - Motors Maintain Gains

New York, Jan. 8.—The market on the Broad Street curb showed a general upward movement today, the most important feature being a withdrawal of many selling orders, causing a pronounced decrease in the supply in certain prominent prices. The Columbia group again attracted most attention because of steady buying of stocks of these companies, both on the exchange and the outside market.

The independent oils were in good demand, and although they receded from the opening, they became strong again in the afternoon. Prices ranged from 8 1/2 to 10, and Ryan Consolidated sold at 11 1/2.
