SCHOOL HEAD FIGHT IS ON AGAIN TODAY

Herrick and Broome Are Leading Candidates Before Board of Education

NEW DEADLOCK FORESEEN

Forces representing the two factions in the Board of Education are lining up for another test of strength today when an attempt will be made to elect a superintendent of schools at the monthly meeting of the board.

What looked at one time like an amicable settlement of the deadlock has, it is believed, at the last moment, assumed the aspect of an old-time partisan struggle and a close fight is expected with the issue much in doubt.

The men who command the most strength in the contest today are conceded to be Dr. Chesnam A. Herrick, president of the board, and Dr. Edwin C. Broome, superintendent of schools of East Orange, N. J., despite the fact that the former was reported as having withdrawn from the race.

In the event of a further deadlock several courses are likely.

MOORE'S FIRST YEAR GIVES CITY SURPLUS

Municipal Balance for 1920 is \$1,854,611—Best for Several Administrations

BANNER PERIOD PREDICTED

During the last year Philadelphia deposited \$1,854,611.94 in the municipal savings bank.

City Controller Hadley reported to Richard Weglein, president of City Council, last night, that settlement of the city's accounts for 1920 leaves the surplus, which will be available for defraying expenses during the current year.

As a result of surplus, President Weglein sees a banner year ahead. Should the surplus for 1921 go beyond that of this year, he says, he can see

a possibility of a reduction in the tax rate for 1922. It is thought likely that Council may use a part of the excess in granting requests for salary increases.
