

### LAWMAKERS MOVE SLOWLY IN DOVER

Three Bills and One Concurrent Resolution Introduced in the House

### MAY NOT GO TO WASHINGTON

Dover, Del., Jan. 14.—Only three bills were presented in the Delaware Legislature yesterday. Representative Clendaniel introduced a measure increasing the amount of money the town of Ellendale can raise by taxation. The committee to which the bill was referred, owing to lack of quorum, met and reported the bill back adversely to the House.

By Representative Warrington—To make the closed season for turtles in Sussex county from April 15 to July 1, instead of March 1 to July 1.

By Representative Kramer—Exempting honorably discharged soldiers and sailors from peddlers' licenses.

Representative Virden introduced a concurrent resolution requiring the state Highway Department to furnish information as to the cost of establishment and maintenance of the police department of the Highway Department by February 1. He also introduced a skeleton bill to create a state constabulary. A proposition will be made to combine the state detective force and a state constabulary for the protection of the state highways.

While the indications point to the cancellation of the reservations made at Washington for the General Assembly and the governor and his staff for the inauguration of President-elect Harding, the committee appointed to perfect such arrangements has so far taken any definite step in that direction.

### UPRISING AGAINST OREGON

Murgula, Carranza Leader, Pursued After Clash in San Luis Potosi

El Paso, Tex., Jan. 14.—General Francisco Murgula, commander of the northern zone of Mexico under the Carranza regime, has taken the field in opposition to the government of President Obregon.

Official dispatches to Consul General Montes de Oca received here tell of a battle between the Murgula forces and those of the government in the state of San Luis Potosi.

The rebel general fled, pursued by federal troops after eight of his men had been killed and a number wounded, according to the reports.

Only Cost Price is Asked in Merchantville, N. J., School

Merchantville, N. J., Jan. 14.—Hot lunches are being served to the pupils of the local schools under the supervision of the Parent Teachers' Association. A small charge, to cover the cost of the material used, is made and the work is done by a rotating committee from the association.

A lunch room has been fitted up in the basement of the building with the co-operation of the Board of Education, and both teachers and pupils are required to eat their lunches here, whether same is carried from home or purchased in the building. The service was inaugurated on Monday and during the week, more than 100 pupils have availed themselves of the service each day.

### DOGS NOW BEING INSURED

N. Y. Company Sets Precedent by Writing Canine Policies

New York, Jan. 14.—It is now possible for Rover, or Buster, or Fido, or any other dog that passes to the happy hunting grounds to leave behind him some bail for his bereaved owners in the way of cash.

An insurance company announced here it would write insurance on dogs, although such a thing never has been done before. For the present each dog will be insured for two-thirds of what his owner thinks he is worth, at the rate of 12 per cent for male canines and 15 per cent for the gentler sex.

One exception is the little fluffy toy dog, who eats too many chocolates and stays too much indoors to make him a healthy risk.
