Harrisburg, Jan. 26—August members of the State Senate and ambitious legislators in the House are calling on the women for their support in the passage of a bill to amend the constitution so as to give the women the right to vote in the general Assembly election. On Jan. 26, Mrs. Hubbs of Philadelphia, of the Pennsylvania League of Women Voters, announced that she would be in Harrisburg to lobby for the bill. Mrs. Hubbs said that, leaving the question of the ripper out of consideration, women were opposed to the plan of specifying that a certain number of men and a certain number of women should be chosen.

She explained that women were opposed to the introduction of a principle of legislation which would distinguish in that way between men and women. Equal suffrage, it was indicated, means equality in respect to holding office.

The women want nothing more for less than the men, they don't want consideration because of sex. They want to be citizens.

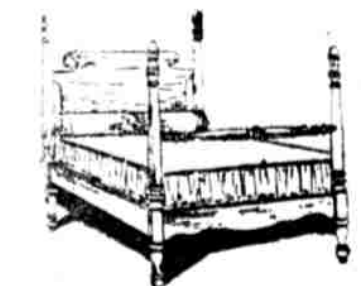
