

DR. TOMKINS WOULD OUST SCHOOL BOARD

Says Public Has Right to Demand Clean-Out and Competent Men Named

HITS BACK AT SHALLCROSS

In a scathing indictment of the Board of Education, the Rev. Floyd W. Tomkins, pastor of Holy Trinity P. E. Church, today advised that the public has a right to demand the resignation of many of the members of the board on the ground of incompetency.

The statement of Dr. Tomkins was made in an attack which he made on an occasion of a public meeting on Wednesday, when he said that many of the members were in their dotage.
