

FORGETS HE'S WED WHEN GIRLS SMILE

"I Love My Wife." Asserts Alleged Bigamist Arrested in Another Tangle

TO STAY AT HOME IN FUTURE

"I love my wife devotedly, but every time another woman smiles at me, I just seem to forget that I am married."

This is the explanation given by James Alfred Gallagher, manager of a chain grocery store at 4934 Market street, who will face United States Commissioner Manley Friday. Gallagher was arrested on a warrant sworn to by the mother and husband of a woman, a cashier in one of the chain stores, who is said to have been taken to Toronto by the store manager.

Mrs. Myrtle Wilkinson, the woman, is the wife of an ex-soldier and chauffeur. This alleged affair of the manager and cashier is said to be his third tangle with women.

Last June Gallagher was charged with bigamy. He is said to have married a Miss Stella Longuecker, cashier of a grocery store in Rochester, Gallaher at the time had his wife and child living here on Forty-third street and Powelton avenue. She now lives in Germantown.

He "Feasted on Drugged Bon-Bons"

His defense was that Miss Longuecker feasted him on drugged bon-bons and while laboring under the influence of the drug, he married her. His wife strenuously stood by her husband and urged him to return to the city, which he did. The new arrest still finds the first Mrs. Gallagher legal, Gallagher says, and he expects her to appear in his behalf Friday.

"My wife is the dearest thing imaginable," Gallagher said while waiting to be taken to the district prison in default of \$1000 bail.

"It's just one affair after another. My advice is to stay as far away from the women as possible. They will break you sooner or later."

"Take my case for instance. I am only twenty-two years old and I have been married for the last five years. I have one child and believe me, the kid don't love my wife, tell them they don't know what they are talking

about. I love her devotedly, but as verse as I am to women, as soon as they smile at me I forget for the time that I am married.

Going to Be Stay-at-Homeer "When I get out after this, believe me I will be a stay-at-homeer for life. My wife has forgiven me and will do all she can to help me."

Legislature Asked for Funds to House New Heavy Artillery Regiment

DR. BROOME TO TAKE UP DUTIES HERE IN MARCH

New Schools' Head Getting Acquainted With Aides Today

Dr. E. G. Broome, newly elected superintendent of schools, today said he expected to be here permanently early in March, in all likelihood in the next regular meeting of the Board of Education, on the second Tuesday in March.

Dr. Broome made the statement this morning after a visit to the administration building, at Nineteenth and Ludlow streets, where he met the associate superintendents and the department heads and conferred informally with them for an hour.

Plans for the armory were announced today by Benjamin W. Demming, secretary of the board in connection with the introduction into the Legislature today of a bill calling for an initial appropriation of \$500,000.

The total cost of the armory building proper will be upward of a million dollars. This is exclusive of the value of the land—a tract of about two and a half acres—which will be donated to the state by a wealthy Philadelphian who is interested in the guard.

The armory board cannot publish at this time either the name of the donor or the exact location of the site. This is because all the land has not been acquired and it is feared premature publication might result in efforts to increase the price for the land.

The new organization in a sense will supplant the Old Second Regiment, originally an infantry group.
