

BURST TIRE LEADS POLICE TO WHISKY

Truck Found to Contain Two Barrels and Eighteen Quart Bottles of Liquor

TWO MEN ARE ARRESTED

The trouble on their motortruck which contained liquor led to the arrest of two men and the seizure of the truck at Frankford avenue and Womrath street at 2 o'clock this morning. Patrolmen Mayer and Fink, of the Frankford station, saw the truck halted at the corner. One of the men was running a tire. The patrolmen looked into the rear of the machine and discovered two barrels they say contained eighteen quarts of whisky. Further investigation revealed the barrels, heavily wrapped with paper. These were found to contain quart bottles of whisky. The patrolmen took the truck and

suspects to the Frankford station. The men said they are Joseph Passolunghi, twenty-two, years old, 129 Center street, Trenton, and Theodore Shennari, twenty-two, of Yardley, Pa. Passolunghi told the police he was unaware the motortruck carried whisky. He said a man had given them \$25 to bring the truck to this city from Trenton. They were to have turned it over to a man at Fourth street and Girard avenue at 3 o'clock this morning, he said. Both men were held for the Federal authorities.

ENDS LIFE IN TERMINAL

Theft of His Money Thought Cause for Man's Suicide

A man entered a porter's room on the train floor of the Reading Terminal late yesterday and shot himself dead. He was identified as Herman G. Martin, forty-two years old, Forty-seventh street near Wallace. In his pockets were eighty cents and a pawn ticket on a watch. Also a receipt for dues from a Masonic lodge. It is believed Martin pawned his watch and bought a revolver to end his life. His widow said she thought her husband's suicide was caused by worry over the theft of \$100 from him by two men who first gave him liquor and then took his money.

WILL SUE ACID-THROWER

Girl Victim in Hospital Makes No Move for Woman's Arrest

Unless there is formal complaint, the police will not investigate the acid-throwing in Eleventh and Walnut streets, Tuesday afternoon, that may disfigure Miss Elsie Weigel for life, it was learned today. Miss Weigel was drenched with acid by a well-dressed woman of middle age who escaped when her victim fell. It was said by the girl that her assailant was jealous of her husband without cause. Miss Weigel is in Hahnemann Hospital. She and her father, Frederick

Weigel, of 1228 North Jessup street, have revealed the identity of the woman to acquaintances, but have not notified the police. They will bring civil action for damages, they say.

Carries Others in Fall

Losing his footing last night while descending the slick-covered elevated steps at Fifth-street and Market streets, Gordon Carroll, forty-four years old, of 1254 South Forty-ninth street, fell headlong to the street, carrying half a dozen other persons with him. Carroll was the only person who suffered injury in the fall, receiving a cut above the right eye. He was taken to the West Philadelphia Hospital.

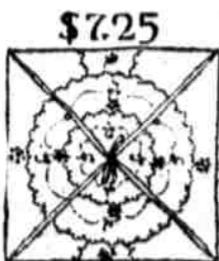
