AUTHOR INSANE AT LOSS OF FRENCH WAR BABY

American Wife Brought Girl to U. S., but She Went Back

New York, Feb. 28.—Is parenthood as strong an instinct with men as with women?

Can love of children make a man give up a woman with whom he is in perfect intellectual accord, who has lived with him for ten years, loving him and standing by him through thick and thin as his wife, friend and helper?

Can a man give up such a woman to go to an ignorant peasant girl, who has become a child for him and whose presence he craves?

These are problems involved in the tragic story of Mrs. Louise MacNichol, wife of Kenneth MacNichol, author and former soldier, which were brought to light in the Essex county Court of Common Pleas at Newark.

Mrs. MacNichol was petitioning that she be appointed guardian of her husband, who is now confined in the Belle Mead County Sanatorium for the Insane.

Mrs. MacNichol and her husband had been childhood friends in a New England village where they had played together, riding together and made up stories together.

He was just beginning to attract the attention of the big magazines, when the war broke out. Shortly after the United States entered the conflict, MacNichol enlisted in the hospital corps.

The climax came when he fell in love with a French girl.

Dr. C. C. Belling, the physician attending her, reported on his case to the American Legion, which has been active in France war, his "biological mating."

The previous marriage had been merely an intellectual union, said Dr. Belling.

The story of how, on his return to the states, Mrs. MacNichol took his wife into France, and how the child that was to come, and how that splendid combination of his year for the girl, and the child born in her own home in Washington, has only now come to light after months of secrecy.

When the mother and child finally went back to France, Mrs. MacNichol became wild with anguish. One night, without having made any plans, she took a train for his New England home, where

HALT WILDWOOD PROJECT

Court Grants Enjoining Writ Against Majority Commissioners

Wildwood, N. J., Feb. 28.—Another writ of certiorari has been served on the majority city commissioners, Smith and Bright, to prevent them from moving the partly demolished boardwalk on Atlantic avenue, between Lincoln and Montgomery avenues.

It was granted by Justice Charles C. Black and is returnable March 11 before Justice William S. Gammeter.

The injunction halts the plans of the majority commissioners to clear and pave Atlantic avenue between Schellenger and Montgomery avenues and to build the new boardwalk closer to the ocean.

A mass-meeting will be held this evening, when the two factions in the dispute which has caused suits and quarrel suits will be heard.
