New York, March 3.—That Chicago opera artists have accepted salary cuts from 20 to 50 per cent under the terms of a new contract with the Chicago Opera House, which will return to the city on March 9, and that the chief conductor in Director-General Mary Garden's successor, Eino Järvinen, returning to Italy on March 9, and that from 500 to 1000 guarantors will be sought to finance the company in place of the \$1,000,000 guaranteed by the group of public-spirited Chicago men who have stood the deficits of previous years, are the principal points in a long statement issued last night at the Manhattan Opera House.
