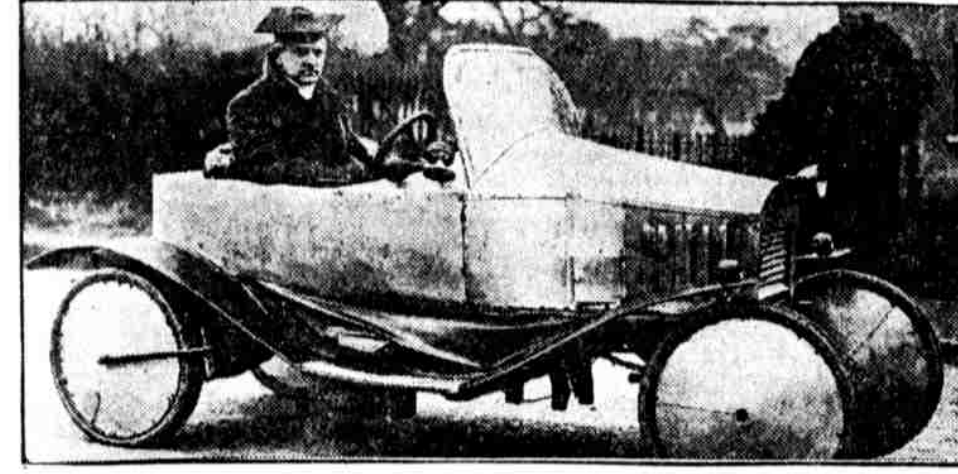

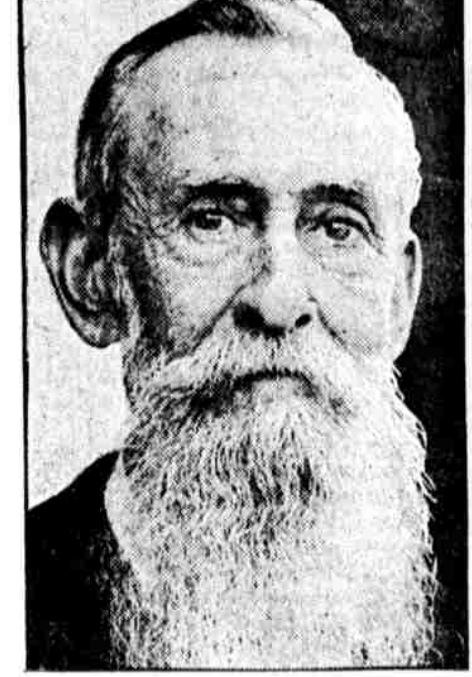
HER PET. Miss Ruth Roland has trained the lion to be as playful as a pet dog. She feeds the animal milk and dog crackers.

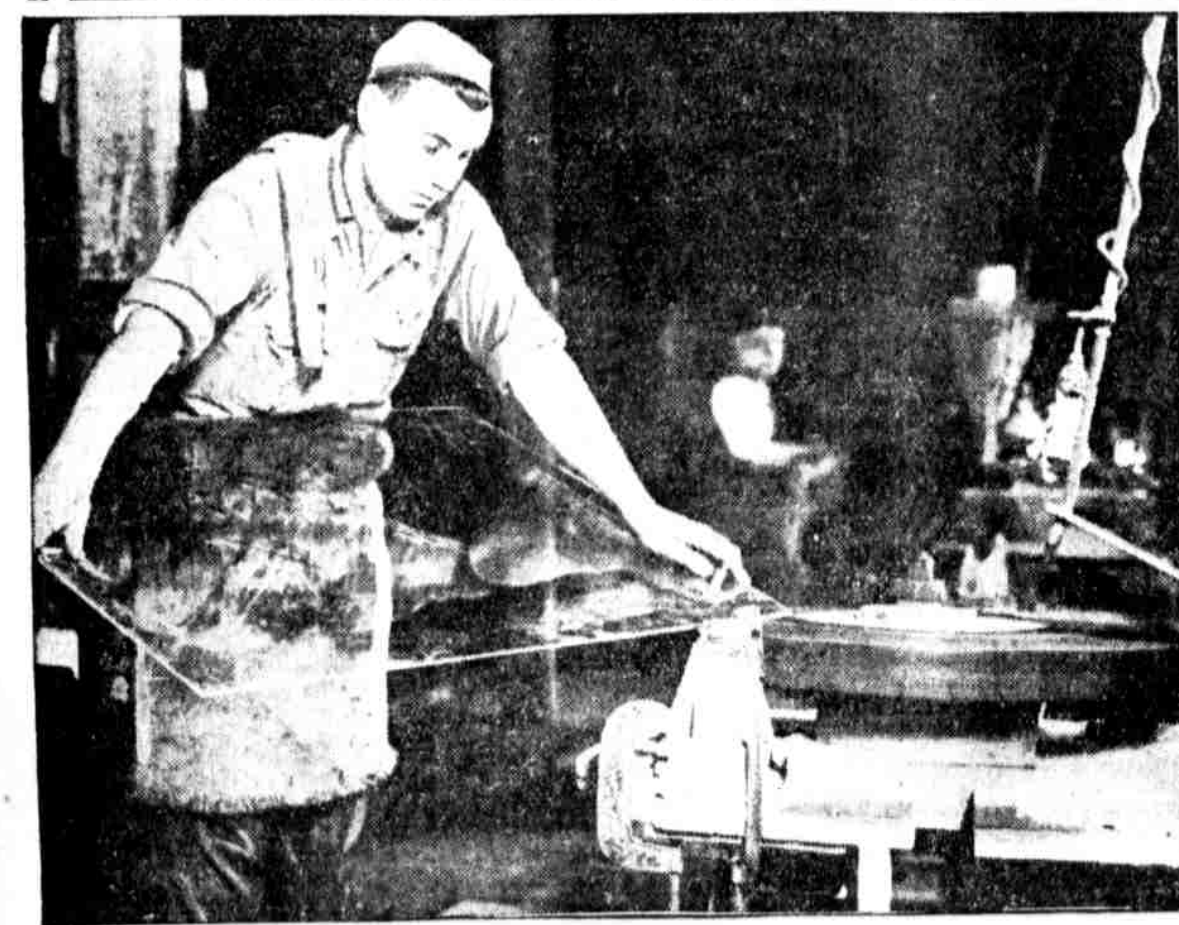
