JENKINTOWN GAS USERS EXPECT TO GET REFUND

Method of Rechecking Bills to Be Passed Upon Soon

The Public Service Commission will pass at the earliest possible date on the method of the refund made to the consumers of the Philadelphia Suburban Gas and Electric Co. charging error in computation of bills submitted for the month of November, 1920.

This refund was made by Commissioner James S. Bennett, after hearing the complaint of Henry Stouffer, a resident of Jenkintown, Philadelphia, who charged that he had been "gouged" in the bill for that month.
