### CAPTURED WITH LASSO

A bull went on a rampage at Third North and Chestnut Streets at 6:30 o'clock this morning, kicked and tossed a man, chased three patrolmen and blocked traffic for an hour before it was lassoed.

The bull was captured about a block from Third Street by a patrolman who had been chasing it since it started its rampage.

As the bull bounded through the streets, one leg being suddenly lame, it charged a patrolman, who was forced to retreat to the rear. The animal rushed so furiously forward that it knocked down two patrolmen and threw them to the ground.

Sergeant Major and Lieutenant Higgins and Captain D. A. K. Hayes, who were on duty at the time, were sent to help capture the bull.


