

## LENINE CAUSE DEI DISORDINI IN ITALIA

L'Azione dei Comunisti fu Ordinata da Mosca per Tentare la Rivoluzione

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Roma, 11 marzo.—Le autorità hanno definitivamente stabilito che l'origine dei recenti disordini comunisti in Italia fu Mosca. In base ai documenti sequestrati dalla polizia risulta che i disordini in paesi furono ordinati da Lenin.

Il movimento comunista in Italia fu soltanto iniziato ed il governo Soviet in Russia nutriva grandi speranze per la rivoluzione italiana. La sua missione era di propagare il comunismo depositato nelle banche svizzere e da queste venivano distribuiti in Italia in nome di agenti segreti.

Roma, 10 marzo.—Dopo aver giunto da Londra segnalano che i giornali inglesi pubblicano che il risultato della Conferenza di Berlino è un insieme di successi degli Alleati, per la quale la tassa da imposta alla Germania sulle esportazioni, rappresenterebbe un insuccesso del Conte Sforza, Ministro per gli Affari Esteri. Il Conte Sforza fino all'ultimo si sarebbe opposto all'applicazione delle sanzioni contro la Germania, ma che poi avrebbe dimostrato di non volerle.

Un dispaccio da Londra recita che il governo di Berlino presenterà agli Alleati una nuova proposta secondo la quale la Germania si assumerebbe di pagare tutti i debiti che gli Alleati hanno con gli Stati Uniti, a patto che non gli venga imposta alcuna indennità.
