WALKER LEADS IN BILLS Philadelphia Representative Has Given 29 Measures to House

Given 29 Measures to House Harrisburg, March 15.—Representa-tive James A. Walker, Philadelphia, is the champion bill introducer of the present session of the State Legislature, records here disclose. So far this ses-sion Walker, who is chairman of the banks and banking committee, has stood sponsor for twenty-nine bills out of a total of 937 offered. In the upper branch of the Assembly Senator Patton, Philadelphia, is giving Walker a run for championship honors. So far of the 506 bills in the Senate, Patton has introduced twenty-seven of them.


Harrisburg, March 15 .-- Under the arging of Senator Vare, the House judiciary general committee made arrangements today to report the equal rights bill out of committee so that a chance for a vote on the floor would be chance for a vote on the floor would be had. The committee held a hearing on the subject, which was attended by about fifty colored people, headed by Bishop L. J. Coppin, of the A. M. E. Church, and Mrs. S. W. Layton, of the Repub-lican women's committee. The bill would make it unlawful for any one to discriminate against people because of race, creed or color.

Harrisburg, March 15.-The Catlin House bill, setting a short game season, passed the House today by a big ma-

passed the House today by a big ma-jority. The measure confines the open game season in Pennsylvania to the month of November and amends certain sec-tions of the laws to provide greater pro-tection for deer and other game. The bill now goes to the Senate, where its passage is predicted.


