

FIRST MAIL UNIONS' HEARING IN 8 YEARS

Hays Tells Labor Representatives Policy for Adjusting Differences

Washington, March 17. — For the first time in eight years, representatives of the postal employees' unions met yesterday with the postmaster general to discuss questions affecting the personnel of the department. Postmaster General Hays, in announcing a new policy for dealing with the employees, said frequent conferences would be held between department officials and representatives of the employees "for the adjustment of all differences."

"Three hundred thousand men and women are engaged in this enterprise," Mr. Hays told the union representatives. "We are going to have 300,000 partners. The postoffice establishment is not just an institution for profit-making, it is an institution for service, and it is the President's purpose that every effort shall be made to improve that service. I know that with 300,000 men and women pledged to serve all the people and honestly discharge that duty, fairly treated and properly appreciated, all partners with us in the great enterprise, we can do the job."

By taking an executive interest in the meetings of local chambers of commerce, boards of trade and other civic and community organizations, Mr. Hays said, "excellent opportunities are afforded for the dissemination of general postal information, essential to the proper conduct of an efficient postal service. Postmasters should avail themselves of such opportunities to solicit the co-operation of civic organizations in securing observance by the general public of the fundamental principles of mailing, the compliance with which on the part of postal patrons is necessary to the discharge of postal duties to the entire satisfaction of the public."

TATTOO SOUGHT IN MURDER

Insurance Fraud Attempt Alleged in Indiana Mystery

Warsaw, Ind., March 17.—Developments yesterday in the investigation of the murder near here Saturday of Leo Lovett, nineteen years old, of Elkhart, seemingly increased the tangle of violence.

H. W. Graham, prosecutor, in a statement said he believed Lovett was killed so that other persons could claim large amounts of insurance. Virgil Decker carried after having identified Lovett's body as that of Decker, who yesterday was formally charged with Lovett's murder.

After Decker was placed in jail here, he was stripped of his clothing to see if he had a rose and dagger tattoo mark on his left arm. Decker, however, had no tattoo marks, although it had been asserted Decker had such a tattoo mark on his arm and two weeks ago had induced Lovett to have a similar insignia placed on his left forearm.

Watches Presented to Policemen

Palmira, N. J., March 17.—In recognition of the vigilance and bravery displayed by Morris Beck, chief of police, and Joseph Rodgers, a policeman, who recently arrested three men whom they detected robbing the department store of Morris Irenbaum, a special committee, consisting of George Wimer, Edward A. King, Albert N. Stewart and Morris Schwartz, presented to each, on behalf of the citizens, a gold watch, artistically engraved with data relating to the service. A fund of more than \$200 was readily subscribed by citizens for the purchase of the awards.

TALAAAT SLAIN IN REVENGE

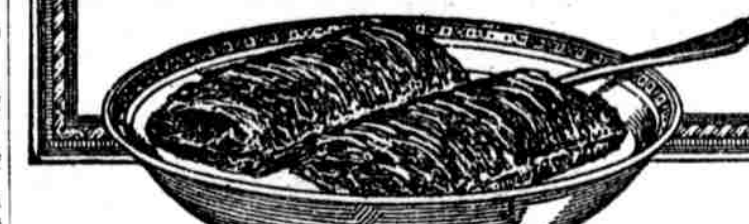
Assassin Says Former Vizier Caused Murder of His Parents

Berlin, March 17.—In a statement made to the police yesterday Solomon Teifirian, the Armenian who Tuesday assassinated Talaat Pasha, former grand vizier and minister of finance of Turkey, said he committed the crime as an act of vengeance against Talaat because Talaat's persecution of the Armenian people, and especially for the murder of Teifirian's parents, who, he asserted, were taken from their home by order of the former grand vizier and put to a horrible death.

The police have ascertained that Teifirian has been in Berlin for a long while, and that he undoubtedly came here for the purpose of assassinating Talaat.
