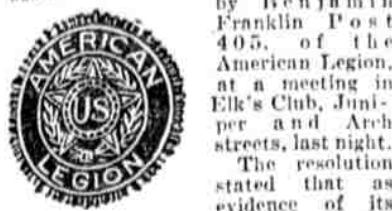

LEGION POST HITS PRO-GERMANISM

Resolves to Attend Gathering April 7 to Promote Real Americanism

"The insidious spreading of pro-German propaganda in the United States," was condemned in a resolution adopted by Benjamin Franklin Post 405 of the American Legion, at a meeting in Elk's Club, Junior and Arch streets, last night.



The resolution stated that as evidence of its approval and support of the movement of the American Legion in fighting such propaganda, the Benjamin Franklin Post will attend the "All-American mass-meeting" to take place in this city, April 7.

"American citizenship stands on the German proposition just where our country and our soldiers stood when the United States entered the war on the side of the Allies," are the words of the resolution. It was introduced by Frank J. McDowell, chairman of the executive committee.

The department of Pennsylvania of the Legion calls the attention of all former service men to the recent passage through Congress of the Wadsworth bill, under which claims may be made for damages to property lost or damaged in the service.

Both officers and enlisted men are authorized, by the provisions of this bill, in making claims for losses incurred in service since April 6, 1917.

John P. Garland, Post 106 will have a coffee klatch on the evening of March 23, at its meeting rooms, Roosevelt Hall, Point Breeze avenue and Wharton street. Proceeds will be used to construct a stand for the post colors.

LEGION MEETING STIRS N. Y.

More Than 100,000 Apply for Tickets to Patriotic Gathering

New York, March 18.—(By A. P.)—Five hundred applications have been received to handle the 20,000 or more persons expected to turn out tonight for the American Legion's all-American meeting in Madison Square Garden.

Applications were received for more than 100,000 tickets, and 20,000 were issued.

Arranged as a protest against the "Horror on the Rhine" meeting, held in the same hall, Legion officials declared the gathering tonight would express disapproval of all "hyphenated propaganda."

General Pershing will be principal speaker at the meeting, over which F. W. Galbraith, national commander of the American Legion, will preside.

Among those who have been invited to attend are Major General Robert Lee Bullard, Rear Admiral Harry McEl, Huse, William Howard Taft, George W. Wickersham, James W. Gerard.
