"The great difficulties the country has experienced, due to the lack of a solidly established bank system, through which the country from one end to the other may receive the benefits of a credit other may receive the benefits of a credit aystem, are so much in evidence and they have given rise to such a critical situation that I need not try to demon-strate to you the supreme necessity of applying a remedy to the chaotic con-dition which in this respect prevails in the republic. It is for these reasons. therefore, that the first matter to which the call (for the convening of Congress) refers, is the enactment of a law that will settle the banking problem.


