

MEXICAN PROBLEM IS SOLVING ITSELF

Chances of Intervention by U. S. Rapidly Fade as Order Is Restored

RECOGNITION DUE LATER

Washington, March 25.—The Mexican problem is solving itself.

While recognition of the Oregon government is still a future contingency, and subject to a preliminary agreement as to the basis of recognition, all reports from the southern republic indicate that conditions there are approaching "normalcy" with a speed undreamed of in days of revolutions and banditry.

Interventionists find small comfort in the news from Mexico City and outlying states south of the Rio Grande. The intervention threatened a year or two ago and which at various times in recent years has seemed almost inevitable, now appears to be a remote possibility.

As Mexico attacks her political and economic problems under Oregon's direction, the prospect that the United States might be forced to take a hand in the settlement is rapidly receding.

This may be stated with considerable definiteness, notwithstanding the hesitations of the Oregon government, that the existing causes of friction between the United States and Mexico can be removed by same treatment and mutual concessions, and that the two governments are kept apart as much by national pride as by fundamental differences of viewpoint.

Bandit Leaders Retire

Here are some of the reports which have come out of Mexico in recent weeks indicating her new tranquility. Rebel and bandit leaders have retired, surrendered or been overthrown.

President Oregon expects within a year to make the first payment on account of accrued interest on Mexico's external loans.

Mexico is on a gold and silver basis. Banks are permitted to do business only on condition that they redeem their currency issues at par.

Intelligent efforts are being made to protect and to solve the agrarian problem by breaking up the big estates and leasing land holdings, many of them illegally acquired, and restoring them to the peons in small tracts.

Mexico's chief need at present is a continuance of domestic peace and order and outside capital to develop her resources.

In his address to the Mexican Congress in February, President Oregon said regarding the banking problem: "The great difficulties the country has experienced, due to the lack of a solidly established bank system, through which the country from one end to the other may receive the benefits of a credit system, are so much in evidence and they have given rise to such a critical situation that I need not try to demonstrate to you the supreme necessity of applying a remedy to this chaotic condition which in this respect prevails in the republic. It is for these reasons, therefore, that the first matter to which I refer is the enactment of a law that will settle the banking problem."

Article 27 Big Issue

Article 27, of the Mexican constitution, nationalizing her mineral resources, is still the chief issue between the two governments. Assurances from Oregon that the Mexican Government does not intend to apply this article retroactively has called for a definition of the term "retroactive." When this is agreed upon, the principal obstacle to the recognition will have been removed.

There will likely be a continuous session lasting all day and probably all night tonight.
