Stokes opposed was eliminated from the bill. Governor Edwards is expected to sign the House Rowland bill, for appointment of additional vice chancellors of the Court of Chancery at salaries of \$14,000 each. Senator Wallworth, of Camden, brought about amendment of the bill passed by the House for one year, to provide for two vice chancellors.

Under suspension of the rules the Senate yesterday passed the Pierson election revision and amendment measure eleven to one. Senator Wallworth being the lone objector to its passage. As passed in the upper house the attempt to prevent women from holding responsible positions was thwarted, as also was that leaving for its purpose the creation of additional positions at the expense of the taxpayers.

The House approved the Senate bill to increase the salaries of the four assistant state education commissioners from \$2000 to \$2500 for each yearly.

Another measure to receive favorable House action was the Mackay Senate concurrent resolution to amend the state constitution for five-year terms for sheriffs and permitting them to have consecutive terms.

In the Senate salary-raising bills received general approval. Tax judges of the Court of Errors and Appeals will receive \$20 instead of \$20 a day and the same judges who sit on the Court of Pardons will get \$20 daily when that pardoning body is in session.

The series of House bills to increase

fees for motor vehicles by 35 per cent were turned over to the Senate for action and will be voted upon next week.

Senator Whitney, of Morris, secured passage of his bill appropriating \$500,000 for printing expenses of the Legislature.

Fuse Fires One-Man Car

When a fuse blew out in a "one-man" trolley car on the Fifth Broadway line of the Public Service Railway Co., at Broadway and Line street, Camden, yesterday afternoon, Edward Kenn, thirty-eight years old, of 841 Penn street, the motorman and conductor, was burned about the hands and face. He was attended at Cooper Hospital. The car was badly damaged and the few passengers escaped by a rear door.

INJURIES FATAL TO CONEY

Dies as Result of Accident in Transcontinental Flight

Natchez, Miss., March 31.—Lieutenant W. D. Coney, who was injured last Friday morning near Crossville, La., while attempting a transcontinental flight, from Jacksonville to San Diego, Calif., died here late yesterday. The lieutenant's back was broken in a fall, and complete paralysis of his body from the chest down resulted. He was attempting to lower his previous record of twenty-two hours twenty-seven minutes, actual flying time from coast to coast, when forced down by engine trouble.

Lieutenant Coney was a resident of Brunswick, Ga., and saw service on the Mexican border in 1910. During the world war he was a flying instructor in the army air service. He was twenty-seven years old.
