

POLICE COMB CITY FOR N. Y. ANARCHIST

Perpetrator of Wall Street Outrage Believed to Be Hiding Here

A notorious anarchist, who is said to be responsible for the bomb explosion which turned a section of Wall street into a shambles last September, is thought to be hiding in this city.

William J. Flynn, chief of the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Justice, arrived here yesterday and spent several hours closeted with Director of Public Safety Cortelyou and Superintendent of Police Mills.

Although no statement would be made by any of these officials for publication, it is known that the man is known to the police and federal authorities. The man wanted is said to have a long criminal record and to have engineered the bomb outrages in this city in the spring of 1919. According to report he fled here at one time, and after perpetrating the Wall street horror, re-

He wore a golf cap pulled down over his forehead and a khaki shirt turned in at the neck.
